BACKGROUND:

Fund 001, General Fund, FY 2017 budget, will need to be amended to recognize increased cash forward for funds carried forward from FY16 to FY17 for projects or purchases not completed in prior fiscal year as well as for state and federal grants, and place those funds into the respective departments for future related expenditures. In addition, recognize a release of reserved revenue funds from the balance sheet for the Law Enforcement Trust fund and place into the Trust Fund department for related expenditure and movement of reserve for contingencies to the Sheriff budget for policing during the upcoming tourist related season.

Fund 101, Transportation, FY 2017 budget, will need to be amended to recognize carry forward funds for projects and equipment not expensed in FY16 for cash forward as well as various grants, (such as CR 2300, Roadway Striping, R & B Wash Rack Awning, Roadway Improvement (Star Ave), Road Resurfacing (Resota & Mckenzie)), and place those funds into the departments for future related expenditures and continuation of projects.

Fund 401, Water System, FY 2017 budget, will need to be amended to recognize funds to be carried forward from FY16 for upgrades to the lime silo, and improvements on the high service pump as well as repairs and engineering expenditures not completed in the prior fiscal year.

Fund 420, Retail Water & Wastewater, FY 2017 budget, will need to be amended to recognize funds to be carried forward from FY16 for expenditures not completed in the prior fiscal year. Fund 430, Solid Waste, FY 2017 budget, will need to be amended to recognize funds to be carried forward from FY16 for expenditures not completed in the prior fiscal year.

Fund 505, Workers Comp, FY 2017 budget, will need to be amended to recognize funds to be carried forward from FY16 for expenditures not completed in the prior fiscal year.







0.75 Yrs Bay County Portfolio Weighted Average Maturity





BACKGROUND:

Albert Bock has been employed by Bay County since 2011. Currently, Mr. Bock is the Wastewater Operations Supervisor. Mr. Bock, in conjunction with Steve Wilson (a non-employee), and at the direction of Aquaconeer, LLC, has assisted in the development and holds partial ownership of numerous systems, products, and processes in the field of wastewater treatment and wastewater biosolids treatment ("Inventions"). These Inventions are in part described in a patent application pending before the United States Patent and Trademark Office.

Separate from his employment duties for Bay County, but with Bay County's consent, Mr. Bock has demonstrated some of the Inventions at the Military Point Regional Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility operated by Bay County and owned severally by Bay County, the City of Callaway, the City of Parker and the City of Springfield pursuant to that certain Military Point Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility Interlocal Agreement dated September 19, 1996. Mr. Bock, Aquaconeer, and Bay County have benefitted from Mr. Bock's demonstrations, implementations, modifications, and installations of systems, products, and processes at the Facility.

The attached Agreement Governing Intellectual Property (**Exhibit 1**) grants Bay County, or any successor operator of the Facility, a royalty-free, perpetual, irrevocable, and non-transferable license to use, modify, and replicate the licensed material for the operation of the Facility. In exchange, the County would grant to Aquaconeer any rights or title to the Inventions or patent, to the extent the County has accumulated any such interest.

AGREEMENT GOVERNING INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

- A. Mr. Bock, in conjunction with Mr. Steve Wilson and at the direction of Aquaconeer, has assisted in the development and holds partial ownership of numerous systems, products, and processes in the field of wastewater treatment and wastewater biosolids treatment ("Inventions"). These Inventions are in part described in United States Patent Application No. 14/734,753, titled, "SYSTEMS AND METHODS FOR ENHANCED FACULTATIVE BIOSOLIDS STABILIZATION" (hereafter "Patent"); Mr. Bock and Mr. Wilson have assigned all of their right, title and interest in the Patent to Aquaconeer;
- B. Mr. Bock is currently employed by Bay County, and separate from his employment duties for Bay County, but with Bay County's consent, Mr. Bock has demonstrated some of the Inventions at the Military Point Regional Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility ("Facility") operated by Bay County and owned severally by Bay County, the City of Callaway, the City of Parker and the City of Springfield (collectively, the "Owners") pursuant to that certain Military Point Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility Interlocal Agreement dated September 19, 1996;
- C. Mr. Bock, Aquaconeer, and Bay County have benefitted from Bay County's consent to allow Mr. Bock's demonstrations, implementations, modifications, and installations of systems, products, and processes at the Facility;
- D. No monetary compensation or fees have been exchanged between the parties in connection with Bay County's use of and benefit from Mr. Bock's systems, products, and processes, namely increased treatment efficiency, cost savings, and improved environmental results;
- E. The parties to this Agreement desire to memorialize their agreement concerning rights to the systems, products, processes and parts of the Invention installed or operating at the Facility as of the Effective Date. (collectively, the "Licensed Material").

THEREFORE, in consideration of the parties' cooperation at the Facility pertaining to the Inventions and the Patent, and the mutual benefits each party has

enjoyed from this cooperation, and all of the other considerations set forth above, the parties agree to the following, as of the Effective Date:

- 1. Mr. Bock and Aquaconeer, for themselves and their successors, assigns, heirs, beneficiaries, and affiliates, grant Bay County, or any successor operator of the Facility, a royalty-free, perpetual, irrevocable, and non-transferable (except to any successor operator of the Facility), license to use, modify, and replicate the Licensed Material for the operation of the Facility.
 - 1.1 Except as specifically set forth in this Agreement, the parties agree that the Licensed Material is offered "as is" and "where is," with no fees or royalties payable to Mr. Bock or Aquaconeer for such use and with no obligation on Mr. Bock or Aquaconeer for the maintenance, repair, or removal of the Licensed Material, except as required in the ordinary course of Mr. Bock's employment with Bay County.
 - 1.2 If and when Mr. Bock's employment with Bay County ceases, Mr. Bock agrees to leave any systems, products, or processes he demonstrated and installed or modified at the Facility in place and warrants that neither he nor any other entity or individual has or will be permitted to acquire a lienor encumbrance upon the Licensed Material.
 - 1.3 Bay County agrees that it will not commercialize or grant sublicenses to the Inventions or the Patent. The parties acknowledge and agree, however, that Bay County co-owns the Facility and operates it for the benefit of all owners and other stakeholders, and expressly agree that Bay County's use of the Licensed Material in connection with its operation of the Facility shall not constitute a breach of this Agreement.
- 2. 2.1 Except as specifically set forth in this Agreement, to the extent that Bay County has accumulated any right or title to the Inventions or Patent, or portions thereof, by any means, Bay County hereby irrevocably assigns such rights or claims to Aquaconeer.
 - 2.2 To the extent that Mr. Bock or Aquaconeer have created any copyrightable material in connection with the Licensed Material, the parties agree as follows:
 - 2.2.1 With regard to such copyrightable material created by Mr. Bock in the scope of his employment with Bay County, Bay County grants back to Mr. Bock and Aquaconeer a royalty-free, perpetual license to

use, distribute, reproduce, and create derivatives of such copyrightable material.

- 2.2.2 With regard to such copyrightable material that Mr. Bock or Aquaconeer have provided or do in the future provide to Bay County, Mr. Bock and Aquaconeer grant Bay County, and any successor operator of the Facility, a royalty-free, perpetual license to use, distribute, reproduce, and create derivatives of such copyrightable material in connection with Bay County's, or successor operator's, use of the Licensed Material.
- 3. In consideration of the mutual benefits to Mr. Bock, Aquaconeer, and Bay County stemming from the demonstration of some of the Inventions at the Facility, Mr. Bock and Bay County agree to continue to cooperatively demonstrate these Inventions in the future, irrespective of Mr. Bock's employment status with Bay County. Specifically, Bay County agrees to allow Mr. Bock, from time to time, to conduct tours of the Facility for interested parties only while Mr. Bock is off-duty and with the following conditions: (1) Mr. Bock agrees to obtain Bay County's prior approval for each tour, with a minimum notice of seven (7) calendar days; (2) Mr. Bock agrees to conduct the tours on a date and at a time approved by Bay County, in such a way as to minimize disruption of normal operations at the facility; (3) visitors to the Facility must comply with the Facility's usual requirements and procedures, including but not limited to signing waivers; and (4) due to the sensitive nature of the Facility, Bay County reserves absolute discretion to refuse tours and visitors at any time, and Mr. Bock and Aguaconeer agree to waive any claim for damages and any cause of action against Bay County on the basis of such refusal. The parties specifically agree that a breach of this section 3 shall not constitute grounds to terminate this Agreement.
- 4. 4.1 Nothing contained in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity limitations on liability for Bay County under §768.28, Florida Statutes.
 - 4.2 Aquaconeer agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Bay County in the event any third party asserts any claim against Bay County regarding patent infringement, unfair competition, trade secret misappropriation, copyright infringement, or violation of restrictive covenant, in connection with Bay County's use of the Licensed Material as

authorized by this Agreement Aquaconeer shall have no obligation to indemnify under this section to the extent that a claim arises out of (a) the direct, induced or contributory infringement resulting from the combination of the Licensed Material with other systems, processes, or materials not described in the Licensed Material or copyrighted material, (b) Bay County's use of the Licensed Material other than as provided or (c) Bay County's or other party's modification of the Licensed Materials.

- 5. Each party agrees to bear its own out-of-pocket costs, attorneys' fees, and recording or assignment fees, if any, incurred in connection with this Agreement.
- 6. 6.1 This agreement is entered into in the State of Florida and the laws of Florida, except where preempted by federal law, shall govern its construction and interpretation, without regard to principles of conflicts of law.
 - 6.2 This agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which constitutes an original as against the party that signed it, and all of which together constitute one agreement.
 - 6.3 If any provision of this agreement is determined to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in full force, if the essential terms and conditions of this agreement for each party remain valid, binding, and enforceable.
 - 6.4 This agreement constitutes the full and final agreement by and among the parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein, and is the complete and exclusive statement of the parties' agreement on the matters contained herein. All prior and contemporaneous negotiations and agreements by and among the parties with respect to the matters contained herein are superseded by this agreement. It may be modified only by a written instrument signed by the parties.
 - 6.5 The recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference and to the extent any of the recitals are not true it is grounds for nullifying this Agreement.
 - 6.6 Each of the parties warrants that it has full power and authority to execute and implement the terms of this Agreement.

7.0 The Owners are third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement and are entitled to the rights and benefits of Bay County as described in this Agreement and entitled to enforce the provisions hereof as if they were parties hereto.

Internment Fee for Unclaimed Indigent Cremains

Board to consider and approve an amendment to the County's policy regarding the cremation of indigent and unclaimed persons. This amendment will create an internment fee of \$125.00 for the cremains, and increase the holding period prior to internment to 180 days.

A budget amendment will be needed to increase the budget for this item if approved. FINANCIAL IMPACT SUMMARY STATEMENT:

This will have a minimal effect on the General Fund as most remains are claimed.

BACKGROUND:

Chapter 406, Part II, Florida Statutes governs the disposition of human remains. Section 406.52, provides the County Commission in accordance with applicable laws and rules, to prescribe policies and procedures for the cremation of indigent and unclaimed indigent persons.

In 1995, this Board established a policy regarding cremation of deceased indigent persons and deceased unclaimed persons. The Board uses local funeral homes, which are on a rotation basis list with the Medical Examiner's Office. Currently the County pays \$750 for cremations.

In 2010, this Board authorized the funeral homes to designate where the cremains (ashes) would be held. Section 497.607(2) directs that the unclaimed cremains be held for at least 120 days.

The County received a request from the funeral home industry to consider reimbursing funeral homes \$125 per cremains to offset the cost of internment at their designated location. Additionally, the holding period prior to internment would be increased from 120 days to 180 days, allowing the families 60 more days to claim the cremains. The number of qualifying cremations averages 110 per year, however most cremains are claimed and will not be stored beyond the 180 day period.

The county's portion of the annual maintenance cost for the railroad crossing traffic control devices for these intersections is \$1,800.

BACKGROUND:

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) submitted the attached Railroad Reimbursement Agreement for the Board's consideration and approval (EXHIBIT 1). The agreement is for the replacement and future maintenance of grade crossing traffic control devices on Frankford Avenue at the existing railroad crossing. These are tripartite agreements between FDOT, Bay Line Railroad, LLC and Bay County. The terms of the agreements are as follows:

- 1 . Bay Line Railroad shall furnish the necessary materials and install automatic grade crossing signals in accordance with FDOT plans and standards.
- 2 . After installation of the signal is completed, fifty percent (50%) of the expense thereof in maintaining the signals shall be borne by the County and fifty percent (50%) shall be borne by Bay Line Railroad.
- Bay Line Railroad shall be responsible for maintenance, adjustment, and future relocation of the signals; however, the party initiating relocation will be responsible for such expenses.
- 4. Bay County shall install and maintain the advance warning signs and railroad crossing pavement markings in accordance with the U.S. Department of Transportation manual on uniform Traffic Control Devices within 30 days after the completion of the project.

5. FDOT shall reimburse all costs incurred by Bay Line Railroad in the installation of the signals.

FDOT has requested that the Board adopt the attached resolution authorizing the execution of the agreements (**EXHIBIT 2**). This request is a normal FDOT practice and Bay County has approved such requests in the past. The County shall be responsible for fifty percent (50%) of annual maintenance costs (\$1,800).

3. After said signals have been installed and found to be in satisfactory working order by the parties hereto, the same shall be immediately put into service, operated and maintained by the COMPANY so long as said COMPANY or its successors or assigns shall operate the said signals at said grade crossing; or until it is agreed between the parties hereto that the signals are no longer necessary or until the said crossing is abandoned; or legal requirements occur which shall cease operation of signals thereat.

Schedule of Annual Cost of Automatic Highway Grade Crossing Devices attached hereto and by this reference made a part

hereof and subject to future revision.

The COMPANY agrees that any future relocation or adjustment of said signals shall be performed by the COMPANY, but at the expense of the party initiating such relocation. Upon relocation the maintenance responsibilities shall be in accordance with the provisions of this agreement. It is further agreed that the cost of maintaining any additional or replacement signal equipment at the same location will be shared as provided under Paragraph 2. above.

- 4. Unless otherwise agreed upon herein, the COUNTY agrees to ensure that at the crossing the advance warning signs and railroad crossing pavement markings will conform to the U.S. Department of Transportation Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices within 30 days of notification that the railroad signal improvements have been completed and that such signs and pavement markings will be continually maintained at an acceptable level.
- 5. The COMPANY hereby agrees to install and/or adjust the necessary parts of its facilities along said road in accordance with the provisions set forth in the:
 - (a) DEPARTMENT Procedure No. 725-080-002 Appendix D.4, and Rule 14.57.011 "Public Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Costs", Florida Administrative Code.
 - EX (b) Federal Highway Administration Federal-Aid Policy Guide, 23 C.F.R. Subchapter G, Part 646, Subpart B, and 23 C.F.R., Subchapter B, Part 140, Subpart I,

and any supplements thereto or revisions thereof, which, by reference hereto, are made a part hereof. The COMPANY further agrees to do all of such work, with its own forces or by a contractor paid under a contract let by the COMPANY, all under the supervision and approval of the DEPARTMENT and the Federal Highway Administration, when applicable.

- 6. Bills for travel expenses specifically authorized in this agreement shall be submitted and paid in accordance with DEPARTMENT Rule 14-57.011 "Public Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Costs" and the Federal Highway Administration Federal-Aid Policy Guide, Subchapter B, Part 140, Subpart I "Reimbursement for Railroad Work."
- 17. In accordance with Section 215.422, Florida Statutes, the following provisions are in this Agreement:
 Contractors providing goods and services to the Department should be aware of the following time frames. Upon receipt, the Department has five (5) working days to inspect and approve the goods and services, unless the Agreement specifies otherwise. The Department has 20 days to deliver a request for payment (voucher) to the Department of Financial Services. The 20 days are measured from the latter of the date the invoice is received or the goods or services are received, inspected and approved.

If a payment is not available within 40 days, a separate interest penalty at a rate as established pursuant to Section 215.422(3)(b), Florida Statutes, will be due and payable, in addition to the invoice amount, to the Contractor. This lease is paid on behalf of the Tax Collector. It is a General Fund expenditure.

BACKGROUND:

The Board of County Commissioners has leased a location (801 Florida Avenue, Lynn Haven, FL) for the Tax Collector from the City of Lynn Haven since February 16, 1999. All renewals and extensions have been used and a new lease agreement is needed.

The lease is for one year with three additional one year renewals at a rental rate of \$19,296.60 per year or \$1,608.05 per month.

Staff recommends the Board approve and authorize the Chairman to execute a one (1) year lease agreement (Exhibit 1) with three (3) additional one (1) year renewal options with the City of Lynn Haven to provide a satellite office for the Tax Collector.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE made this 7 day of February 2017, by and between the City of Lynn Haven, Florida, as Lessor (the "City") and Bay County, Florida, as Lessee, acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners (the "County").

WITNESSETH:

In consideration of rent to be paid and the mutual benefits herein, the City leases to the County approximately twenty-nine hundred (2900) square feet of enclosed office space in the building at 801 Florida Avenue, Lynn Haven, Florida 32444, subject to the terms and conditions hereof, which are:

- 1. The term of this lease is for one (1) year beginning March 1, 2017 and continuing until February 28, 2018. Thereafter, the County Manager and the City Manager may jointly agree to extend this Lease Agreement for three (3) additional one-year renewal terms on the same terms and conditions and covenants contained herein.
- 2. Rent is nineteen thousand, two hundred ninety-six dollars and 60 cents (\$19,296.60) per year, payable in installments of \$1,608.05 per month, due and payable in advance on the first day of each month. Performance by the County of any of its obligations under this Agreement shall be subject to and contingent upon the availability of monies lawfully available and appropriated for such purposes.
- 3. Any rental payment, which is not paid within ten (10) days after its due date shall bear a late charge of six percent (6%) of the amount due.
- 4. If any time during the term of this lease the County or the City determines that the other is in breach of this lease agreement, the non-breaching party shall give written notice to the breaching party of the alleged breach, giving an opportunity to cure such breach within 30 days of the breaching party's receipt of the written notice ("Cure Period"). If the alleged breach continues after the Cure Period expires, the County and the City shall have the right to terminate this lease agreement upon the giving of thirty (30) days prior, written notice to the other party.
- 5. The County shall be responsible for all routine minor maintenance of the leased property such as light replacement, interior painting, air conditioning filters and

faucet and toilet repairs. Major repairs such as roof repair/replacement, heating and air conditioning repair/replacement of major components, and extensive plumbing and electrical work shall be the responsibility of the City. For determining maintenance and repair responsibility, a dollar figure not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) for labor and materials shall be paid by the County. The City shall be responsible for maintenance and repair for work exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500).

- 6. The County shall not modify the leased premises or construct any improvements therein without prior written consent of the City, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 7. Upon written notice by the County of the need for repairs for which the City is responsible, the City shall proceed with reasonable diligence to repair the premises in a good workmanlike manner; however, the City shall not be responsible for water or other damage to property of the County in the absence of notice from the County of need for repair.
- 8. All fixtures partitions, equipment and personal property required by the County in the conduct of its operation shall be supplied and constructed by the County, and shall be referred to hereinafter as the "County's Improvements and Property". When no default exists, the County's Improvements and Property may be removed upon termination of the lease, provided that there be no damage to the realty, or only inconsequential damage caused by removal which shall be repaired by the County, provided, however, any provision or implication in this lease to be contrary notwithstanding, no lien, charge, claim or demand shall attach to the interest of the City in the leased premises or the parcel on account of any contract, act, or omission of the County pursuant to the Construction Lien Law of Florida, or otherwise.
- 9. Utilities including gas and electricity shall be paid by the County. Water, sewer, and garbage collection shall be furnished by the City. Ninety (90) gallon roll-away garbage containers shall be provided by the City for County's use. The parking areas at the rear (eastside) and southside of the building shall be dedicated to the Tax Office for customer and employee parking.
- 10. The County shall maintain at its expense both property and casualty insurance upon the structure, furniture, fixtures, equipment, records, and all other

items located in the leased premises. The City shall be named as an additional insured on all insurance policies. The County shall supply a certificate that such insurance is in force and said insurance coverage shall not be canceled without at least twenty (20) days notice to the City.

- 11. The County agrees to maintain general public insurance upon the leased premises and all activities conducted by the County therein, in an amount at least equal to the waiver of sovereign immunity cap. The City shall be named as an additional insured. The County shall supply a certificate that such insurance is in force.
- 12. The City shall be held harmless against all claims for bodily injury, sickness, disease, death or personal injury or damage to property or loss of use resulting therefrom, arising out of the agreement, unless such claims are a result of the City's sole negligence. The parties agree that this clause shall not waive the benefits or provisions of Section 768.28 F.S. or any similar provisions of law.
- 13. The City shall allow the County to use the existing installed telephone system. Maintenance and monthly usage charges for the telephone system shall be at County expense.
- 14. The County shall not assign its interest in this lease or in the leased premises, or sublease all or any part of the leased premises, without first obtaining the City's consent. Any assignment or sublease to which the City consents shall not relieve the County of its obligations under this lease, unless otherwise mutually agreed.
- 15. The City and its authorized representatives shall have the right to enter the leased premises during the County's business hours, and at all other reasonable times with prior notice, except for emergencies, for the purpose of:
 - A. Determining whether the leased premises are in good condition and whether the County is complying with its obligations under this lease;
 - B. Doing any necessary maintenance and to make any restoration to the leased premises or the building and other improvements in which the leased premises are located that the City has the right or obligation to perform;

C. Showing the leased premises, or posting "for rent" or "for lease" signs during the last thirty (30) days of the term.

The City shall conduct its activities on the leased premises as allowed in this section in a manner that will cause the least possible inconvenience, annoyance, or disturbance to the County.

16. Any notice, demand, request, or consent that either party desires or is required to be given by this lease shall be in writing and shall be deemed sufficient if sent by United States certified mail, return receipt requested, or courier service requiring a receipt, to the following:

Exhibit B SCOPE OF COASTAL ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING SERVICES January 2017

Introduction:

This scope of engineering services to be performed by CB&I Coastal Planning & Engineering, Inc. (CB&I) is for construction coastal engineering services in support of the 2017 interim renourishment of Panama City Beach.

The following will be provided by CB&I under the scope of services:

Task 1: Pre-Construction

Before construction begins, CB&I will coordinate with State and Federal agencies and the selected Contractor as required. A CB&I engineer will attend the pre-construction conference in person and additional team members will participate in the meeting via phone as necessary. The permits will be reviewed and discussed as required by the permit. We will participate in the meeting and provide input as related to the project and scope of work, the construction methodology, technical specifications and schedule, construction access and work areas, and the specific conditions of the permits and approvals for the project.

CB&I will prepare 2 bound copies of the bid package including permits, construction plans and technical specifications. These packages will be kept on site at each active construction area for use by the County's 3rd party construction inspector.

Based upon the pre-construction surveys collected by the Contractor, CB&I will recalculate project volumes by reach prior to construction. In consultation with the Tourist Development Council (TDC), construction volumes by reach will be finalized to meet the TDC's project objectives. As construction progresses, construction templates will be refined to achieve the target construction volumes by reach, based upon the before-dredge surveys collected by the Contractor.

Task 2: During Construction

CB&I will conduct construction observations to determine if construction of the beach renourishment project is substantially in compliance with the plans and specifications, and with permit authorizations granted for the work. It is assumed the dredging portion of the construction phase will be up to 30 days long. During the beach renourishment construction, CB&I will be on-site every day of active work to observe the compliance of the beach renourishment project with regulatory approvals and communicate all findings to the TDC project manager. An engineering representative familiar with construction observation and construction administration will observe construction daily, with periodic evening and dredge visits, and be on call throughout project construction. Daily contractor reports and permit-

required environmental monitoring reports will be reviewed and their submission to the appropriate agencies tracked by the on-site engineer.

CB&I will be in attendance and participate in weekly construction progress meetings in person and via conference call. CB&I will also provide office engineering support during the construction phase, and supplemental site visits by a senior coastal engineer approximately once per week.

CB&I will be assisted by 3rd party construction inspectors hired by the County, during active construction. The inspector will perform duties defined by a quality assurance/quality control task list prepared by CB&I and the TDC project manager. CB&I will provide supplies and direction for the inspector to perform hourly monitoring of the placed sand quality.

Sand quality will be a priority during all site visits and CB&I engineers will review screening methods, and progress samples collected by the construction inspectors. In compliance with the FDEP permitted sediment QA/QC plan, CB&I will collect and analyze sand samples and prepare and submit the permit-required sediment testing results report.

Beach survey data will be collected by the contractor, which CB&I will review for quality assurance and provide confirmation of the computation of fill placement volumes provided by the contractor.

Following notification that construction activities are deemed to be complete and all payment sections have been approved, CB&I will observe demobilization of the construction and staging areas. If applicable, a punch list of remaining tasks or actions to be addressed by the Contractor will be prepared. CB&I will conduct a final observation of the construction and staging areas following final clean up.

If the construction activities are down for more than 2 days, the down days beyond 2 will not be counted towards CB&I's allotted active construction days. During construction services will resume once construction activities resume.

Task 3: Post-Construction

A CB&I Professional Engineer will serve as the engineer of record for this project and will visit the site during and after construction is completed. After receipt of necessary project documentation, the engineer of record will prepare the project certification. Based largely on surveys, daily reports and observations made by CB&I and inspectors, CB&I will prepare a project certification and as-built report. The post-construction/annual monitoring survey and report is not part of this proposal.

CB&I will review in progress and final applications for payment and will make recommendations to the TDC.

Task 4: Contingency Support

Based on the contractor's proposed construction schedule, it is anticipated that there will be up to 30 days of active dredging and sand placement. If the construction schedule is extended, Task 4 will be utilized for CB&I to conduct additional engineering services during active construction including: on sight observations, contractor coordination, engineering calculations and progress meetings. This task will be on an informal notice to proceed basis from the TDC.

Confidentiality Statement

The information contained in this proposal is confidential commercial information and shall not be disclosed, except for evaluation purposes, provided that if a contract is awarded to CB&I Coastal Planning & Engineering Inc. as a result of or in connection with the submission of this proposal, the requester shall have the right to use or disclose the data to the extent provided in the contract. This restriction does not limit the requestor's right to use or disclose any technical data obtained from another source without restriction.

BACKGROUND:

On October 1, 2013 the Board approved the Iron Humate Residual Disposal Services contract with R&E Farms, LLC to haul and dispose of Water Treatment Plant process sludge (Exhibit 1). On August 5, 2014 The Board approved Amendment #1 authorizing a 5% price increase, and on September 17, 2014 Amendment #2 was approved, acknowledging the merger of R&E Farms, LLC into GreenSouth Solutions, LLC.

The original contract estimated an annual disposal quantity of approximately 5,000 wet tons. However, additional plant maintenance and a capital improvement project for maintaining the plant sediment basins have required additional disposal needs. Amendment #3 provides for additional quantities to be hauled and disposed at the contracted rate (Exhibit 2).

Therefore, staff recommends Board: 1) Approve Amendment #3 to the Iron Humate Residual Disposal Services contract to allow for additional quantities to be hauled and disposed at the contracted rate, and 2) Authorize the Chairman to execute the contract amendment.

CONTRACT 13-36 for IRON HUMATE RESIDUAL DISPOSAL SERVICES

This Contract, dated October 1, 2013 is between the Bay County Board of County Commissioners, at 840 West 11th Street, Panama City, FL 32401 ("County"), and R&E Farms, LLC., at 625 Burnt Street, Black, AL 36314 ("Contractor").

1. Scope of Work

The County desires to hire Contractor to provide Iron Humate Residual Disposal Services. The Contractor will perform those services stated in the attached **Exhibit 1**, Iron Humate Residual Disposal Scope of Services. The Contractor hereby agrees to provide the following services to the County according to ITB 13-36 Iron Humate Residual Disposal Services said documents being incorporated into this agreement as if fully set out herein, and the Contractors response thereto, said documents being attached as **Exhibit 2**, to the extent they are not inconsistent with this Agreement.

The Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining and maintaining all necessary operating and environmental permits and/or licenses in connection with its performance of its obligations under this agreement. All methods and means employed during the execution of this contract cannot violate any FDEP and USEPA regulations

2. Term

This Contract shall commence upon Notice to Proceed and continue in effect through September 30, 2014. At the sole discretion of the COUNTY, the contract may be renewed for three (3) additional one-year periods under the same terms and bid prices.

Contract Price

The COUNTY shall pay the CONTRACTOR for services provided pursuant to the following schedule: CONTRACTOR shall bill the COUNTY based on the CONTRACTOR'S proposal cost of \$29.00 per wet ton hauled and disposed by primary method of disposal (land application) or \$60.00 per wet ton hauled and disposed by alternate method of disposal (landfill) as identified in Bay County Bid Number ITB 13-36. Payments shall be made in accordance with the Florida Prompt Payment Act, Chapter 218, Florida Statutes.

4. Independent Contractor

At all times material to this Contract, Contractor shall be an independent contractor and Contractor, Contractor's employees, subcontractors, or agents shall not be considered as agents, representatives, employees or servants of the County. Contractor assumes full responsibility for supervising and directing its own employees, subcontractors or agents.

5. Contractor's Personnel

Contractor has the exclusive right to hire and terminate its employees and may transfer or reassign any of its employees to other work of the Contractor. The direction of the work of Contractor's employees shall be under the exclusive control of Contractor. If the County objects to the presence or performance of any employee of Contractor, Contractor shall remove such employee from County premises.

6. Cooperation

Contractor agrees to perform each phase of the work at the scheduled time and in the scheduled sequence. Contractor will cooperate with the Utility Services Director or their designee as requested and specifically to allow the County to inspect the performance of work of this Contract.

7. Materials, Supplies, Etc.

Contractor shall furnish and supply all tools, materials, consumable supplies and equipment, safety devices and equipment, and any special clothing that are required to perform the work of this Contract and consistent with the requirements of the ITB.

8. <u>County Representative</u>

The County Utility Services Director or a designee has authority to designate the work to be done by Contractor, to inspect such work, and to resolve questions which arise between the parties. The Contractor or the Contractor's designee will deal with the County's representative on matters relating to the performance of the work. The County shall have the authority to stop the work whenever it deems such action necessary to secure the safe and proper performance of the work assignment.

9. Laws, Rules and Regulations

- a. General Laws: Contractor shall give all notices required of it by law and shall comply with all Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations governing Contractor's performance of this Contract and the preservation of public health and safety. Upon request by the County, Contractor shall provide proof of such compliance to the County.
- b. Illegal Alien Labor: Contractor shall comply with all provisions state and federal law regarding the hiring and continued employment of aliens not authorized to work in the United States. Contractor shall not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien to perform work under this contract or enter into a contract with a subcontractor that fails to certify to the Contractor that the subcontractor is in compliance with such laws. Contractor agrees that it shall confirm the employment eligibility of all employees through participation in E-Verify or an employment eligibility program approved by the Social Security Administration and will require the same of any subcontractors. Contractor shall pay all cost incurred to initiate and sustain the verification programs.
- c. Termination for Cause: Failure of the Contractor to comply with the provision of this section shall constitute grounds for the County to immediately terminate this Contract for cause and declare the Contractor to be non-responsible for bidding or proposing on future contracts for one year from the date the County notifies the Contractor of such non-compliance.

10. Insurance

During the term of this Contract, Contractor will purchase and maintain insurance and comply with the Bay County Insurance Requirements which are attached as **Exhibit 3** to this Contract and incorporated by reference.

12. Hold Harmless and Indemnification

- a. The Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the County, and its officers and employees, from any and all claims, suits, actions, damages, liabilities, expenditures, or causes of action of any kind, losses, penalties, interest, demands, judgments, and costs of suit, including attorney's fees and paralegals' fees, for any expense, damage, or liability incurred by any of them, whether for bodily or personal injury or death, property damage, direct or consequential damages, or economic loss, including environmental impairment, arising directly or indirectly, on account of or in connection with Contractor's performance of the contract or by any person, firm, or corporation to whom any portion of the performance of this Contract is subcontracted to or used by the Contractor, or by any other person.
- b. The parties understand and agree that such indemnification by the Contractor relating to any matter which is the subject of this Contract shall extend throughout the term of this Contract and any statutes of limitations thereafter.
- c. The Contractor's obligation shall not be limited by or in any way to any insurance coverage or by any provision in or exclusion or omission from any policy of insurance.

13. <u>Duty to Pay Defense Costs and Expenses</u>

- a. The Contractor agrees to reimburse and pay on behalf of the County the cost of the County's legal defense, through and including all appeals, and to include all attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses of any kind for any and all 1) claims described in the Hold Harmless and Indemnification paragraph or 2) other claims arising out of the Contractor's performance of the Contract and in which the County has prevailed.
- b. The County shall choose its legal defense team, experts, and consultants and invoice the Contractor accordingly for all fees, costs and expenses upon the conclusion of the claim.
- c. Such payment on the behalf of the County shall be in addition to any and all other legal remedies available to the County and shall not be considered to be the County's exclusive remedy.

14. Notices

Any notice to be given by the parties shall be in writing and deemed to have been duly given if and when deposited in the United States registered mail, return receipt requested, properly stamped and addressed to:

The Contractor shall notify the Bay County Purchasing Department of any change to its address. The Purchasing Department will disseminate the address change to all applicable departments and agencies including Finance. The Contractor's notification of address change is sufficient if sent by email or facsimile.

15. <u>Assignment</u>

Contractor shall not assign in whole or in part any part of the work of this Contract except with prior written consent of the County.

16. Entire Agreement

All proposals, negotiations and representations regarding the work of this Contract are merged in this instrument. Any amendment or modification of this Contract shall be in writing and signed by the duly authorized representatives of the parties.

17. <u>Termination of Contract</u>

The County may terminate this Contract at any time for cause and may also terminate this Contract with or without cause by giving at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice to Contractor.

18. Conflicts

In the case of any conflict between the provisions of this Contract and other contract documents, the following priority for interpretation of those document provisions shall be followed:

- a. The provisions of this contract prevail first.
- b. The bid form and attachments are next.
- c. The initial bid provisions are final priority.

19. Governing Law & Venue

This Contract is governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The proper venue for any action regarding this contract is in the appropriate Court in Bay County, Florida.

2. Specifications:

- a. The treatment residual is free of debris such as stones, paper, plastic, wood and other waste products.
- b. The treatment residual does not typically contain specific impurities in excess of the following limits (by dry weight):

- Pesticides and herbicides are typically non-detectable in the treatment residual.
- d. The percent solids of the treatment residuals is in the 14-60% range and it passes the paint filter criteria.
- e. Contractor agrees to provide and pay for all sampling and testing required at no expense to Bay County.
- f. Specifications Hauling of Iron Humate Residuals

The weight of each truckload shall be based on the weight of the truck (first empty, then full) as weighed on the certified scales at the Bay County Waste to Energy facility. This facility is located approximately 7 miles north of the Water Plant on US Highway 231 at the Bay Industrial Park. The operating hours at the Waste to Energy facility are from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

There is no charge to the Contractor for the weighing service at the Bay County Waste to Energy facility. However, if the Contractor uses certified scales at any other location, the Contractor is responsible for the payment of the weighing service and the scale ticket must be sent to the Bay County Utility Services Department within (5) five days.

The truck number and the time and date of the weigh-in service must be listed on the scale ticket. The truck weight will be used to calculate payment for each truckload.

Any and all treatment residuals accepted by the Contractor are the responsibility of the Contractor, with no risk or liability to Bay County.

- g. The Contractor agrees to haul and dispose of or reuse the partially dried treatment residuals anytime the volume stored reaches a minimum of approximately 100 cubic yards. Bay County will notify the Contractor when this volume is reached and will request that hauling operations begin within 2 business days. At least an estimated 75% of the stored residuals must be removed within the next 7 calendar days after notification from Bay County. Bay County agrees to provide a front-end loader and operator to load the open haul trucks provided by the bidder. Trucks must arrive at the Water Treatment Plant before 3:00 p.m. to be loaded.
- 3. The Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining and maintaining all necessary operating and environmental permits and/or licenses in connection with its performance of its obligations under this agreement. All methods and means employed during the execution of this contract cannot violate any FDEP and USEPA regulations

4. Commercial Conditions:

a. <u>Pricing</u>: All pricing shall be in terms of a price per wet ton of iron humate residuals hauled and disposed of. The price of the Iron Humate Residuals Disposal shall be fixed for the Initial Term of this agreement and shall not be subject to any price escalation or fuel surcharges (the "Base Price"). If the parties agree to renew the agreement, Bay County may consider a price change in any of the renewal years based on verifiable changes in the marketplace.

EXHIBIT 3 BAY COUNTY INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. LOSS CONTROL/SAFETY

- a. Precaution shall be exercised at all times by the Contractor for the protection of all persons, including employees, and property. The Contractor shall be expected to comply with all laws, regulations or ordinances related to safety and health, shall make special effort to detect hazardous conditions and shall take prompt action where loss control/safety measures should reasonably be expected.
- b. The County may order work to be stopped if conditions exist that present immediate danger to persons or property. The Contractor acknowledges that such stoppage will not shift responsibility for any damages from the Contractor to the County.
- c. The Contractor acknowledges that possession, use, or threat of use of weapons or firearms is not permitted on County property, including in the Contractor's vehicles, unless such possession or use of a weapon is a necessary and an approved requirement of the contract.

2. DRUG FREE WORK PLACE REQUIREMENTS

All contracts with individuals or organizations that wish to do business with the Bay County Board of Commissioners, a stipulation will be made in the contract or purchase order that requires contractors, subcontractors, vendors or consultants to have a substance abuse policy. The employees of such contractors, subcontractors, vendors or consultants will be subject to the same rules of conduct and tests as the employees of the Bay County Board of Commissioners. In the event of an employee of a supplier of goods or services is found to have violated the Substance Abuse Policy, that employee will be denied access to the County's premises and job sites. In addition, if the violation(s) is/are considered flagrant, or the County is not satisfied with the actions of the contractor, subcontractor, vendor, or consultant, the County can exercise its right to bar all of the contractor's, subcontractor's, vendor's, or consultants employees from its premises or decline to do business with the contractor, subcontractor, vendor or consultant in the future. All expenses and penalties incurred by a contractor, subcontractor, vendor or consultant as a result of a violation of the County's Substance Abuse Policy shall be borne by the contractor, subcontractor, vendor, or consultant.

3. INSURANCE - BASIC COVERAGES REQUIRED

a. The Contractor shall procure and maintain the following described insurance, except for coverages specifically waived by the County, on policies and with insurers acceptable to the County. These insurance requirements shall not limit the liability of the Contractor. The County does not represent these types or amounts of insurance to be sufficient or adequate to protect the Contractor's interests or liabilities, but are merely minimums.

- b. Except for workers' compensation and professional liability, the Contractor's insurance policies shall be endorsed to name the County as an additional insured to the extent of the County's interests arising from this agreement, contract, or lease.
- c. Except for workers' compensation, the Contractor waives its right of recovery against the County, to the extent permitted by its insurance policies.
- d. The Contractor's deductibles/self-insured retentions shall be disclosed to the County and may be disapproved by the County. They shall be reduced or eliminated at the option of the county. The Contractor is responsible for the amount of any deductible or self-insured retention.
- e. Insurance required of the Contractor or any other insurance of the Contractor shall be considered primary, and insurance of the County shall be considered excess, as may be applicable to claims which arise out of the Hold Harmless, Payment on Behalf of the County, Insurance, Certificates of Insurance and any Additional Insurance provisions of this agreement, contract or lease.

f. WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain workers' compensation insurance for all workers' compensation obligations imposed by state law and employer's liability limits of at least \$500,000 each accident and \$500,000 each employee/\$500,000 policy limit for disease. The Contractor shall also purchase any other coverages required by law for the benefit of employees. The Contractor shall provide to the County an Affidavit stating that he meets all the requirements of Florida Statute 440.02(14)(d).

g. GENERAL, AUTOMOBILE AND EXCESS OR UMBRELLA LIABILITY COVERAGE

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain coverage on forms no more restrictive than the latest editions of the Commercial or Comprehensive General Liability and Business Auto policies of the Insurance Services Office. **Minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence** for all liability must be provided, with excess or umbrella insurance making up the difference, if any, between the policy limits of underlying policies (including employers liability required in the Workers' compensation Coverage section) and the amount of coverage required.

h. GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE

Commercial General Liability - Occurrence Form Required Coverage A shall include bodily injury and property damage liability for premises, operations, products and completed operations, independent contractors, contractual liability covering this agreement contract or lease, and broad form property damage, and property damage resulting from explosion, collapse or underground (x,c,u) exposures. Coverage B shall include personal injury. Coverage C, medical payments, is not required.

PRODUCTS/COMPLETED OPERATIONS

The Contractor is required to continue to purchase products and completed operations coverage, at least to satisfy this agreement, contract or lease, for a minimum of three years beyond the County's acceptance of renovation or construction projects.

j. BUSINESS AUTO LIABILITY COVERAGE

Business Auto Liability coverage is to include bodily injury and property damage arising out of ownership, maintenance or use of any auto, including owned, non-owned and hired automobiles and employee non-ownership use.

k. EXCESS OR UMBRELLA LIABILITY COVERAGE

Umbrella Liability insurance is preferred, but an Excess Liability equivalent may be allowed. Whichever type of coverage is provided, it shall not be more restrictive than the underlying insurance policy coverages.

I. CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE

- 1. Required insurance shall be documented in Certificates of Insurance which provide that the County shall be notified at least 30 days in advance of cancellation, nonrenewal or adverse change. The Certificate Holder will be addressed as the BAY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, 840 W. 11th Street, Panama City, Florida 32401. All certificates, cancellation, nonrenewal or adverse change notices should be mailed to this address. Each Certificate will address the service being rendered to the County by the Contractor. The County shall be named as an Additional Insured for both General Liability and Business Auto Liability.
- 2. New Certificates of Insurance are to be provided to the County at least 15 days after coverage renewals.
- 3. If requested by the County, the Contractor shall furnish complete copies of insurance policies, forms and endorsements.
- 4. For the Commercial General Liability coverage the Contractor shall, at the option of the County, provide an indication of the amount of claims payments or reserves chargeable to the aggregate amount of the liability coverage.

m. RECEIPT OF INSUFFICIENT CERTIFICATES

Receipt of certificates or other documentation of insurance or policies or copies of policies by the County, or by any of its representatives, which indicate less coverage than required does not constitute a waiver of the Contractor's obligation to fulfill the insurance requirements herein.

4. ADDITIONAL INSURANCE If checked below, the County requires the following additional types o insurance.
Professional Liability/Malpractice/Errors or Omissions Coverage The Contractor shall purchase and maintain professional liability or malpractice or errors or omissions insurance with minimum limits of N/A per occurrence. If a claims made form of coverage is provided, the retroactive date of coverage shall be no later than the inception date of claims made coverage, unless the prior policy was extended indefinitely to cover prior acts. Coverage shall be extended beyond the policy year either by a supplementa extended reporting period (ERP) of as great duration as available, and with no less coverage and with reinstated aggregate limits, or by requiring that any new policy provide a retroactive date no later than the inception date of claims made coverage.
Property Coverage for Leases The Contractor shall procure and maintain for the life of the lease, all risk/special perils (including sinkhole) property insurance (or its equivalent) to cover loss resulting from damage to or destruction of the building and personal property/contents. Regular FINANCIAL IMPACT SUMMARY STATEMENT:

> The General Fund will only pay out portions of the \$750,000 less any fees (approximately \$250k) that are credited to the company as the company achieves its' job milestones. It is estimated that the impact could be \$400k-\$500k from the General Fund over a period of years.

BACKGROUND:

GKN Aerospace Florida, Inc. (f/k/a "Project Gondola") recently announced its plans to establish a manufacturing facility in Bay County. In May 2016, the Board approved a resolution (#3377) recommending the company be approved as a Qualified Target Industry (QTI) Business and committing local financial support for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program. After extensive due diligence performed by multiple state agencies, the company's QTI application was approved. This company has also been approved for the Governor's Quick Action Closing Fund and the University of West Florida's Industry, Recruitment Retention and Expansion Fund ("IRREF Grant").

A proposed Bay County Industry Recruitment, Retention and Expansion Grant Agreement would commit to providing funds and credits to the company to assist in the creation and retention of high paying jobs in Bay County. The proposed grant agreement would establish a fund in the original principal amount of \$750,000, which may be reduced by the amount of credits, rebates, refunds or waivers of fees, tax exemptions, or such other manner of capital reimbursement or imbursement issued by the Board to the benefit of the company. Similar to the IRREF Grant and the QTI Program, this grant would be performance-based and payments would not be made until job, wage and capital investment criteria are met and applicable taxes are paid. The grant would be disbursed in annual installments calculated based on the actual number of net new jobs that have been created and maintained in accordance with the requirements of the agreement. The company will be required to create at least 170 net new, private sector full-time equivalent jobs at an annual wage of \$63,156 in Bay County by December 31, 2020, or a mutually agreeable date, and maintain each of those jobs for at least three years from the date of their creation. The company must also expend or invest, or compel a third party to expend invest, at least \$55,000,000 on either equipment, construction of new capital facilities, or improvements made to existing capital facilities to be used in the operation of the project in Bay County.

The local economic impact of these net new high-wage jobs and capital investments amounts to an additional 155 new indirect and induced jobs in the Bay County economic and a total economic impact of \$69,481,730. The local fiscal impact of this project amounts to \$696,822 in annual tax revenue. Please see the attached letter from the HAAS Center (Exhibit 1) outlining additional economic impact information.

The Bay Economic Development Alliance supports this company and its plans to establish a facility in Bay County and create 170 new jobs at an average wage of \$63,156, which is 150% of the current average wage in Bay County.

Thank you for reaching out to us in your economic development efforts. As CREO has been a part of your project, we have decided to internally fund it as part of the Haas Center's commitment to regional economic development efforts.

As I understand the project, you would like a rough estimate of the economic and fiscal impact of creating 170 "net new" jobs in Bay County in the "Other Aircraft Parts and Auxiliary Equipment Manufacturing" industry (NAICS 336413, Sector 359 in IMPLAN). We would normally engage in extensive fact gathering with the client to confirm industry spending patterns, supply chains and worker output in order to run such a scenario within IMPLAN, which is an applied economic Input-Output Model (current version 4.1.0.29851). However, you have indicated that such a level of precision is not required for your purposes. Since this is an entirely new industry in Bay County, we imported national industry spending patterns and output per worker ratios from Okaloosa County to estimate the multipliers for Bay County. The results below should be considered for informational purposes only based upon broad assumptions which have not been verified by the Haas Center.

Glossary of Terms (http://support.implan.com/index.php?option=com_glossary&task=list):

<u>Direct effects</u>. The set of expenditures applied to the predictive model (i.e., I/O multipliers) for impact analysis. It is a series (or single) of production changes or expenditures made by producers/consumers as a result of an activity or policy. These initial changes are determined by an analyst to be a result of this activity or policy. Applying these initial changes to the multipliers in an IMPLAN model will then display how the region will respond, economically to these initial changes.

<u>Indirect effects</u>. The impact of local industries buying goods and services from other local industries. The cycle of spending works its way backward through the supply chain until all money leaks from the local economy, either through imports or by payments to value added. The impacts are calculated by applying Direct Effects to the Type I Multipliers.

<u>Induced effects.</u> The response by an economy to an initial change (direct effect) that occurs through respending of income received by a component of value added. IMPLAN's default multiplier recognizes that labor income (employee compensation and proprietor income components of value added) is not a leakage to the regional economy. This money is recirculated through the household spending patterns causing further local economic activity.

<u>Output</u>. Output represents the value of industry production. In IMPLAN these are annual production estimates for the year of the data set and are in producer prices. For manufacturers this would be sales plus/minus change in inventory. For service sectors production = sales. For Retail and wholesale trade, output = gross margin and not gross sales.

<u>Value added</u>. The difference between an industry's or an establishment's total output and the cost of its intermediate inputs. It equals gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, plus inventory change) minus intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased from other industries or imported). Value added consists of compensation of employees, taxes on production and imports less subsidies, and gross operating surplus. (BEA) Gross value added is the value of output less the value of intermediate consumption; it is a measure of the contribution to GDP made by an individual producer, industry or sector; gross value added is the source from which the primary incomes of the SNA are generated and is therefore carried forward into the primary distribution of income account. (SNA)

<u>Labor Income</u>. All forms of employment income, including Employee Compensation (wages and benefits) and Proprietor Income.

Employment / Jobs. A job in IMPLAN = the annual average of monthly jobs in that industry (this is the same definition used by QCEW, BLS, and BEA nationally). Thus, 1 job lasting 12 months = 2 jobs lasting 6 months each = 3 jobs lasting 4 months each. A job can be either full-time or part-time.


BACKGROUND:

The Florida Department of Transportation has appropriated funding for the construction of a sidewalk on Minnesota Avenue from CR 2321 Baldwin Road to Mosley Drive (**EXHIBIT 1**). The project is within the City of Lynn Haven jurisdiction however the new sidewalk will be a continuation of the sidewalk constructed as a portion of Baldwin Road Widening project. FDOT has requested assistance from Bay County for the execution of the Construction of this project. Provisions in the agreement provide for reimbursement of up to \$37,500 for staff time in project management and inspection.

The agreement authorizes expenditures of funds in the amount of \$250,000 for the construction of the project and no local match is required. - **2. Purpose of Agreement:** The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the Department's participation in the construction of Minnesota Avenue Sidealk Project, as further described in Exhibit "A", Project Description and Responsibilities attached to and incorporated in this Agreement ("Project"), to provide Department financial assistance to the Agency, state the terms and conditions upon which Department funds will be provided, and to set forth the manner in which the Project will be undertaken and completed.
- **3. Term of Agreement:** The Agency agrees to complete the Project on or before <u>February 28, 2018</u>. If the Agency does not complete the Project within this time period, this Agreement will expire on the last day of the scheduled completion as provided in this paragraph unless an extension of the time period is requested by the Agency and granted in writing by the Department prior to the expiration of this Agreement. Expiration of this Agreement will be considered termination of the Project. The cost of any work performed after the expiration date of this Agreement will not be reimbursed by the Department.

4. Project Cost:

- **A.** The total cost of the Project is \$ 250,000. This amount is based upon the schedule of funding in Exhibit "B", Schedule of Funding attached to and incorporated in this Agreement. The Agency agrees to bear all expenses in excess of the total cost of the Project and any deficits involved. The schedule of funding may be modified by mutual agreement as provided for in paragraph 5.I.
- **B.** The Department agrees to participate in the Project cost up to the maximum amount of \$250,000 and as more fully described in Exhibit "B". This amount includes Federal-aid funds which are limited to the actual amount of Federal-aid participation.
- **C.** Project costs eligible for Department participation will be allowed only from the date of this Agreement. It is understood that Department participation in eligible Project costs is subject to:
 - i. Legislative approval of the Department's appropriation request in the work program year that the Project is scheduled to be committed;

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- ii. Availability of funds as stated in subparagraphs 5.L. and 5.M. of this Agreement;
- iii. Approval of all plans, specifications, contracts or other obligating documents and all other terms of this Agreement; and
- iv. Department approval of the Project scope and budget at the time appropriation authority becomes available.

5. Requisitions and Payments:

- **A.** The Agency shall provide quantifiable, measurable, and verifiable units of deliverables. Each deliverable must specify the required minimum level of service to be performed and the criteria for evaluating successful completion. The Project and the quantifiable, measurable, and verifiable units of deliverables are described more fully in Exhibit "A".
- **B.** Invoices shall be submitted by the Agency in detail sufficient for a proper pre-audit and post-audit based on the quantifiable, measurable and verifiable units of deliverables as established in Exhibit "A". Deliverables must be received and accepted in writing by the Department's Project Manager prior to payments.
- C. The Agency shall charge to the Project account all eligible costs of the Project except costs agreed to be borne by the Agency or its contractors and subcontractors. Costs in excess of the programmed funding or attributable to actions which have not received the required approval of the Department shall not be considered eligible costs. All costs charged to the Project, including any approved services contributed by the Agency or others, shall be supported by properly executed payrolls, time records, invoices, contracts or vouchers evidencing in proper detail the nature and propriety of the charges.
- **D.** Supporting documentation must establish that the deliverables were received and accepted in writing by the Agency and must also establish that the required minimum level of service to be performed based on the criteria for evaluating successful completion as specified in Exhibit "A" was met.
- **E.** Bills for travel expenses specifically authorized in this Agreement shall be submitted on the Department's Contractor Travel Form No. 300-000-06 and will be paid in accordance with Section 112.061, Florida Statutes and the most current version of the Disbursement Handbook for Employees and Managers.
- **F.** Payment shall be made only after receipt and approval of goods and services unless advance payments are authorized by the Chief Financial Officer of the State of Florida under Chapters 215 and 216, Florida Statutes. If the Department determines that the performance of the Agency is unsatisfactory, the Department shall notify the Agency of the deficiency to be corrected, which correction shall be made within a time-frame to be specified by the Department. The Agency shall, within five days after notice from the Department, provide the Department with a corrective action plan describing how the Agency will address all issues of contract non-performance, unacceptable performance, failure to meet the minimum performance levels, deliverable deficiencies, or contract non-compliance. If the corrective action plan is unacceptable to the Department, the Agency shall be assessed a non-performance retainage equivalent to 10% of the total invoice amount. The retainage shall be applied to the invoice for the then-current billing period. The retainage shall be withheld until the Agency resolves the deficiency. If the deficiency is subsequently resolved, the Agency may bill the Department for the retained amount during the next billing period. If the Agency is unable to resolve the deficiency, the funds retained may be forfeited at the end of the Agreement's term.
- **G.** Agencies providing goods and services to the Department should be aware of the following time frames. Inspection and approval of goods or services shall take no longer than 20 days from the Department's receipt of the invoice. The Department has 20 days to deliver a request for payment (voucher) to the Department of Financial Services. The 20 days are measured from the latter of the date the invoice is received or the goods or services are received, inspected, and approved.

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If a payment is not available within 40 days, a separate interest penalty at a rate as established pursuant to **Section 55.03(1), F.S.**, will be due and payable, in addition to the invoice amount, to the Agency. Interest penalties of less than one (1) dollar will not be enforced unless the Agency requests payment. Invoices that have to be returned to an Agency because of Agency preparation errors will result in a delay in the payment. The invoice payment requirements do not start until a properly completed invoice is provided to the Department.

A Vendor Ombudsman has been established within the Department of Financial Services. The duties of this individual include acting as an advocate for Agencies who may be experiencing problems in obtaining timely payment(s) from a state agency. The Vendor Ombudsman may be contacted at (850) 413-5516.

- H. Records of costs incurred under the terms of this Agreement shall be maintained and made available upon request to the Department at all times during the period of this Agreement and for five years after final payment is made. Copies of these documents and records shall be furnished to the Department upon request. Records of costs incurred include the Agency's general accounting records and the project records, together with supporting documents and records, of the contractor and all subcontractors performing work on the project, and all other records of the Contractor and subcontractors considered necessary by the Department for a proper audit of costs.
- I. Prior to the execution of this Agreement, a Project schedule of funding shall be prepared by the Agency and approved by the Department. The Agency shall maintain said schedule of funding, carry out the Project, and shall incur obligations against and make disbursements of Project funds only in conformity with the latest approved schedule of funding for the Project. The schedule of funding may be revised by execution of a Local Agency Program ("LAP") Supplemental Agreement between the Department and the Agency. The Agency acknowledges and agrees that funding for this project may be reduced upon determination of the agency's contract award amount. If revised, a copy of the Supplemental Agreement shall be forwarded to the Department's Comptroller. No increase or decrease shall be effective unless it complies with fund participation requirements of this Agreement and is approved by the Department's Comptroller.
- J. If, after Project completion, any claim is made by the Department resulting from an audit or for work or services performed pursuant to this Agreement, the Department may offset such amount from payments due for work or services done under any agreement which it has with the Agency owing such amount if, upon demand, payment of the amount is not made within 60 days to the Department. Offsetting any amount pursuant to this paragraph shall not be considered a breach of contract by the Department.
- **K.** The Agency must submit the final invoice on the Project to the Department within 120 days after the completion of the Project. Invoices submitted after the 120-day time period may not be paid.
- L. The Department's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature. If the Department's funding for this Project is in multiple fiscal years, funds approval from the Department's Comptroller must be received each fiscal year prior to costs being incurred. See Exhibit "B" for funding levels by fiscal year. Project costs utilizing these fiscal year funds are not eligible for reimbursement if incurred prior to funds approval being received. The Department will notify the Agency, in writing, when funds are available.
- **M.** In the event this Agreement is in excess of \$25,000 and has a term for a period of more than one year, the provisions of Section 339.135(6)(a), Florida Statutes, are hereby incorporated:

"The Department, during any fiscal year, shall not expend money, incur any liability, or enter into any contract which, by its terms, involves the expenditure of money in excess of the amounts budgeted as available for expenditure during such fiscal year. Any contract, verbal or written, made in violation of this subsection is null and void, and no money may be paid on such contract. The Department shall require a statement from the comptroller of the Department that funds are available prior to entering into any such contract or other binding commitment of funds. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the making of contracts for periods exceeding 1 year, but any contract so made shall be

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executory only for the value of the services to be rendered or agreed to be paid for in succeeding fiscal years, and this paragraph shall be incorporated verbatim in all contracts of the Department which are for an amount in excess of \$25,000 and which have a term for a period of more than 1 year."

- **6. Department Payment Obligations:** Subject to other provisions of this Agreement, the Department will honor requests for reimbursement to the Agency pursuant to this Agreement. However, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the Department may elect by notice in writing not to make a payment if:
 - **A.** The Agency shall have made misrepresentation of a material nature in its application, or any supplement or amendment to its application, or with respect to any document or data furnished with its application or pursuant to this Agreement;
 - **B.** There is any pending litigation with respect to the performance by the Agency of any of its duties or obligations which may jeopardize or adversely affect the Project, the Agreement or payments to the Project;
 - **C.** The Agency shall have taken any action pertaining to the Project which, under this Agreement, requires the approval of the Department or has made a related expenditure or incurred related obligations without having been advised by the Department that same are approved;
 - D. There has been any violation of the conflict of interest provisions contained in paragraph 16.J.; or
 - **E.** The Agency has been determined by the Department to be in default under any of the provisions of the Agreement.

The Department may suspend or terminate payment for that portion of the Project which the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA"), or the Department acting in lieu of FHWA, may designate as ineligible for Federal-aid.

In determining the amount of the payment, the Department will exclude all Project costs incurred by the Agency prior to the Department's issuance of a Notice to Proceed ("NTP"), costs incurred after the expiration of the Agreement, costs which are not provided for in the latest approved schedule of funding in Exhibit "B" for the Project, costs agreed to be borne by the Agency or its contractors and subcontractors for not meeting the Project commencement and final invoice time lines, and costs attributable to goods or services received under a contract or other arrangements which have not been approved in writing by the Department.

- **7. General Requirements:** The Agency shall complete the Project with all practical dispatch, in a sound, economical, and efficient manner, and in accordance with the provisions in this Agreement, and all applicable laws. The Project will be performed in accordance with all applicable Department procedures, guidelines, manuals, standards, and directives as described in the Department's <u>Local Agency Program Manual</u>, which by this reference is made a part of this Agreement. Time is of the essence as to each and every obligation under this Agreement.
 - **A.** A full time employee of the Agency, qualified to ensure that the work being pursued is complete, accurate, and consistent with the terms, conditions, and specifications of this Agreement shall be in responsible charge of the Project, which employee should be able to perform the following duties and functions:
 - i. Administers inherently governmental project activities, including those dealing with cost, time, adherence to contract requirements, construction quality and scope of Federal-aid projects;
 - ii. Maintains familiarity of day to day Project operations, including Project safety issues;
 - **iii.** Makes or participates in decisions about changed conditions or scope changes that require change orders or supplemental agreements:
 - **iv.** Visits and reviews the Project on a frequency that is commensurate with the magnitude and complexity of the Project;

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- **v.** Reviews financial processes, transactions and documentation to ensure that safeguards are in place to minimize fraud, waste, and abuse;
- **vi.** Directs Project staff, agency or consultant, to carry out Project administration and contract oversight, including proper documentation;
- **vii.** Is aware of the qualifications, assignments and on-the-job performance of the Agency and consultant staff at all stages of the Project.
- B. Once the Department issues the NTP for the Project, the Agency shall be obligated to submit an invoice or other request for reimbursement to the Department on a quarterly basis, beginning from the day the NTP is issued. If the Agency fails to submit quarterly invoices to the Department, and in the event the failure to timely submit invoices to the Department results in the "FHWA" removing any unbilled funding or the loss of State appropriation authority (which may include the loss of state and federal funds, if there are state funds programmed to the Project), then the Agency will be solely responsible to provide all funds necessary to complete the Project and the Department will not be obligated to provide any additional funding for the Project. The Agency waives the right to contest such removal of funds by the Department, if the removal is related to FHWA's withdrawal of funds or if the removal is related to the loss of State appropriation authority. In addition to the loss of funding for the Project, the Department will also consider the de-certification of the Agency for future LAP Projects. No cost may be incurred under this Agreement until after the Agency has received a written NTP from the Department. The Agency agrees to advertise or put the Project out to bid thirty (30) days from the date the Department issues the NTP to advertise the Project. If the Agency is not able to meet the scheduled advertisement, the District LAP Administrator should be notified as soon as possible.
- **C.** If all funds are removed from the Project, including amounts previously billed to the Department and reimbursed to the Agency, and the Project is off the state highway system, then the Department will have to request repayment for the previously billed amounts from the Agency. No state funds can be used on off-system projects, unless authorized pursuant to Exhibit "G", State Funds Addendum, which will be attached to and incorporated in this Agreement in the event state funds are used on the Project.
- **D.** In the event that any election, referendum, approval, permit, notice or other proceeding or authorization is required under applicable law to enable the Agency to enter into this Agreement or to undertake the Project or to observe, assume or carry out any of the provisions of the Agreement, the Agency will initiate and consummate, as provided by law, all actions necessary with respect to any such matters.
- **E.** The Agency shall initiate and prosecute to completion all proceedings necessary, including Federal-aid requirements, to enable the Agency to provide the necessary funds for completion of the Project.
- **F.** The Agency shall submit to the Department such data, reports, records, contracts, and other documents relating to the Project as the Department and FHWA may require. The Agency shall use the Department's Local Agency Program Information Tool and applicable information systems as required.
- G. Federal-aid funds shall not participate in any cost which is not incurred in conformity with applicable federal and State laws, the regulations in 23 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) and 49 C.F.R., and policies and procedures prescribed by the Division Administrator of FHWA. Federal funds shall not be paid on account of any cost incurred prior to authorization by FHWA to the Department to proceed with the Project or part thereof involving such cost (23 C.F.R. 1.9 (a)). If FHWA or the Department determines that any amount claimed is not eligible, federal participation may be approved in the amount determined to be adequately supported and the Department shall notify the Agency in writing citing the reasons why items and amounts are not eligible for federal participation. Where correctable non-compliance with provisions of law or FHWA requirements exists. Federal funds may be withheld until compliance is obtained. Where non-compliance is not correctable, FHWA or the Department may deny participation in parcel or Project costs in part or in total. For any amounts determined to be ineligible for federal reimbursement for which the Department has advanced payment, the Agency shall promptly reimburse the Department for all such amounts within 90 days of written notice.

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- **H.** For any project requiring additional right-of-way, the Agency must submit to the Department an annual report of its real property acquisition and relocation assistance activities on the project. Activities shall be reported on a federal fiscal year basis, from October 1 through September 30. The report must be prepared using the format prescribed in 49 C.F.R. Part 24, Appendix B, and be submitted to the Department no later than October 15 of each year.
- **8. Audit Reports:** The administration of resources awarded through the Department to the Agency by this Agreement may be subject to audits and/or monitoring by the Department. The following requirements do not limit the authority of the Department to conduct or arrange for the conduct of additional audits or evaluations of federal awards or limit the authority of any State agency inspector general, the State of Florida Auditor General or any other State official. The Agency shall comply with all audit and audit reporting requirements as specified below.
 - **A.** In addition to reviews of audits conducted in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, monitoring procedures may include but not be limited to on-site visits by Department staff and/or other procedures including, reviewing any required performance and financial reports, following up, ensuring corrective action, and issuing management decisions on weaknesses found through audits when those findings pertain to federal awards provided through the Department by this Agreement. By entering into this Agreement, the Agency agrees to comply and cooperate fully with any monitoring procedures/processes deemed appropriate by the Department. The Agency further agrees to comply and cooperate with any inspections, reviews, investigations, or audits deemed necessary by the Department, State of Florida Chief Financial Officer (CFO) or State of Florida Auditor General.
 - **B.** The Agency, a non-federal entity as defined by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and as defined by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, as a subrecipient of a federal award awarded by the Department through this Agreement is subject to the following requirements:
 - i. In the event the Agency expends a total amount of federal awards equal to or in excess of the threshold established by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F - Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, the Agency must have a federal single or programspecific audit for such fiscal year conducted in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F - Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014. Exhibit "1", Federal Financial Assistance (Single Audit Act) to this Agreement provides the required federal award identification information needed by the Agency to further comply with the requirements of OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and the requirements of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014. In determining federal awards expended in a fiscal year, the Agency must consider all sources of federal awards based on when the activity related to the federal award occurs, including the federal award provided through the Department by this Agreement. The determination of amounts of federal awards expended should be in accordance with the guidelines established by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F - Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014. An audit conducted by the State of Florida Auditor General in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F - Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, will meet the requirements of this part.
 - ii. In connection with the audit requirements, the Agency shall fulfill the requirements relative to the auditee responsibilities as provided in OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and as provided in 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014.

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- iii. In the event the Agency expends less than the threshold established by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, in federal awards, the Agency is exempt from federal audit requirements for that fiscal year. However, the Agency must provide a single audit exemption statement to the Department at FDOTSingleAudit@dot.state.fl.us no later than nine months after the end of the Agency's audit period for each applicable audit year. In the event the Agency expends less than the threshold established by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, in federal awards in a fiscal year and elects to have an audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, the cost of the audit must be paid from non-federal resources (i.e., the cost of such an audit must be paid from the Agency's resources obtained from other than federal entities).
- iv. The Agency must electronically submit to the Federal Audit Clearinghouse (FAC) at https://harvester.census.gov/facweb/ the audit reporting package as required by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and as required by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, within the earlier of 30 calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or nine months after the end of the audit period. The FAC is the repository of record for audits required by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and for audits required by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, and this Agreement. However, the Department requires a copy of the audit reporting package also be submitted to FDOTSingleAudit@dot.state.fl.us within the earlier of 30 calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or nine months after the end of the audit period as required by OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and as required by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014.
- v. Within six months of acceptance of the audit report by the FAC, the Department will review the Agency's audit reporting package, including corrective action plans and management letters, to the extent necessary to determine whether timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies has been taken pertaining to the federal award provided through the Department by this Agreement. If the Agency fails to have an audit conducted in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, for fiscal years beginning before December 26, 2014, and in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F Audit Requirements, for fiscal years beginning on or after December 26, 2014, the Department may impose additional conditions to remedy noncompliance. If the Department determines that noncompliance cannot be remedied by imposing additional conditions, the Department may take appropriate actions to enforce compliance, which actions may include but not be limited to the following:
 - 1. Temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by the Agency or more severe enforcement action by the Department;
 - 2. Disallow (deny both use of funds and any applicable matching credit for) all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
 - 3. Wholly or partly suspend or terminate the federal award;
 - 4. Initiate suspension or debarment proceedings as authorized under 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and federal awarding agency regulations (or in the case of the Department, recommend such a proceeding be initiated by the federal awarding agency);
 - 5. Withhold further federal awards for the Project or program:
 - Take other remedies that may be legally available.
- vi. As a condition of receiving this federal award, the Agency shall permit the Department, or its designee, the CFO or State of Florida Auditor General access to Agency's records including

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financial statements, the independent auditor's working papers and project records as necessary. Records related to unresolved audit findings, appeals or litigation shall be retained until the action is complete or the dispute is resolved.

- C. The Agency shall retain sufficient records demonstrating its compliance with the terms of this Agreement for a period of five years from the date the audit report is issued and shall allow the Department, or its designee, the CFO or State of Florida Auditor General access to such records upon request. The Agency shall ensure that the audit working papers are made available to the Department, or its designee, the CFO, or State of Florida Auditor General upon request for a period of five years from the date the audit report is issued unless extended in writing by the Department.
- **9. Termination or Suspension of Project:** The Department may, by written notice to the Agency, suspend any or all of the Agency's obligations under this Agreement until such time as the event or condition resulting in such suspension has ceased or been corrected or the Department may terminate this Agreement in whole or in part at any time the interest of the Department requires such termination.
 - A. If the Department determines that the performance of the Agency is not satisfactory, the Department shall notify the Agency of the deficiency in writing with a requirement that the deficiency be corrected within thirty (30) days of such notice. Such notice shall provide reasonable specificity to the Agency of the deficiency that requires correction. If the deficiency is not corrected within such time period, the Department may either (1) immediately terminate the Agreement as set forth in paragraph 9.B. below, or (2) take whatever action is deemed appropriate by the Department to correct the deficiency. In the event the Department chooses to take action and not terminate the Agreement, the Agency shall, upon demand, promptly reimburse the Department for any and all costs and expenses incurred by the Department in correcting the deficiency.
 - **B.** If the Department terminates the Agreement, the Department shall notify the Agency of such termination in writing, with instructions to the effective date of termination or specify the stage of work at which the Agreement is to be terminated.
 - C. If the Agreement is terminated before the Project is completed, the Agency shall be paid only for the percentage of the Project satisfactorily performed for which costs can be substantiated. Such payment, however, shall not exceed the equivalent percentage of the contract price. All work in progress on Department right-of-way will become the property of the Department and will be turned over promptly by the Agency.
 - **D.** The Department reserves the right to unilaterally cancel this Agreement for refusal by the Agency or any contractor, sub-contractor or materials vendor to allow public access to all documents, papers, letters or other material subject to the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and made or received in conjunction with this Agreement unless the records are exempt.
 - E. Upon receipt of any final termination or suspension notice under this paragraph 9., the Agency shall proceed promptly to carry out the actions required in such notice, which may include any or all of the following: (a) necessary action to terminate or suspend, as the case may be, Project activities and contracts and such other action as may be required or desirable to keep to a minimum the costs upon the basis of which the financing is to be computed; or (b) furnish a statement of the Project activities and contracts and other undertakings the cost of which are otherwise includable as Project costs. The termination or suspension shall be carried out in conformity with the latest schedule, plan, and cost as approved by the Department or upon the basis of terms and conditions imposed by the Department upon

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the failure of the Agency to furnish the schedule, plan, and estimate within a reasonable time. The closing out of federal financial participation in the Project shall not constitute a waiver of any claim which the Department may otherwise have arising out of this Agreement.

10. Contracts of the Agency:

- A. Except as otherwise authorized in writing by the Department, the Agency shall not execute any contract or obligate itself in any manner requiring the disbursement of Department funds, including consultant or construction contracts or amendments thereto, with any third party with respect to the Project without the written approval of the Department. Failure to obtain such approval shall be sufficient cause for nonpayment by the Department. The Department specifically reserves the right to review the qualifications of any consultant or contractor and to approve or disapprove the employment of such consultant or contractor.
- B. It is understood and agreed by the parties to this Agreement that participation by the Department in a project with the Agency, where said project involves a consultant contract for engineering, architecture or surveying services, is contingent on the Agency's complying in full with provisions of Section 287.055, Florida Statutes, Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act, the federal Brooks Act, 23 C.F.R. 172, and 23 U.S.C. 112. At the discretion of the Department, the Agency will involve the Department in the consultant selection process for all projects funded under this Agreement. In all cases, the Agency shall certify to the Department that selection has been accomplished in compliance with the Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act and the federal Brooks Act.
- C. The Agency shall comply with, and require its consultants and contractors to comply with applicable federal law pertaining to the use of Federal-aid funds. The Agency shall comply with the provisions in the FHWA-1273 form as set forth in Exhibit "C", FHWA 1273 attached to and incorporated in this Agreement. The Agency shall include FHWA-1273 in all contracts with consultants and contractors performing work on the Project.
- 11. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Policy and Obligation: It is the policy of the Department that DBE's, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 26, as amended, shall have the opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts financed in whole or in part with Department funds under this Agreement. The DBE requirements of applicable federal and state laws and regulations apply to this Agreement.

The Agency and its contractors agree to ensure that DBE's have the opportunity to participate in the performance of this Agreement. In this regard, all recipients and contractors shall take all necessary and reasonable steps in accordance with applicable federal and state laws and regulations to ensure that the DBE's have the opportunity to compete for and perform contracts. The Agency and its contractors and subcontractors shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of contracts, entered pursuant to this Agreement.

- 12. Compliance with Conditions and Laws: The Agency shall comply and require its contractors and subcontractors to comply with all terms and conditions of this Agreement and all federal, state, and local laws and regulations applicable to this Project. Execution of this Agreement constitutes a certification that the Agency is in compliance with, and will require its contractors and subcontractors to comply with, all requirements imposed by applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including the "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion Lower Tier Covered Transactions," in 49 C.F.R. Part 29, and 2 C.F.R. Part 200 when applicable.
- **13. Performance Evaluations:** Agencies are evaluated on a project-by-project basis. The evaluations provide information about oversight needs and provide input for the recertification process. Evaluations are submitted to the Agency's person in responsible charge or designee as part of the Project closeout process. The Department provides the evaluation to the Agency no more than 30 days after final acceptance.
 - A. Each evaluation will result in one of three ratings. A rating of Unsatisfactory Performance means the Agency failed to develop the Project in accordance with applicable federal and state regulations, standards and procedures, required excessive District involvement/oversight, or the Project was brought in-house by the Department. A rating of Satisfactory Performance means the Agency developed the

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Project in accordance with applicable federal and state regulations, standards and procedures, with minimal District involvement/oversight. A rating of Above Satisfactory Performance means the Agency developed the Project in accordance with applicable federal and state regulations, standards and procedures, without District involvement/oversight.

- **B.** The District will determine which functions can be further delegated to Agencies that continuously earn Satisfactory and Above Satisfactory evaluations.
- **14. Restrictions, Prohibitions, Controls, and Labor Provisions:** During the performance of this Agreement, the Agency agrees as follows, and agrees to require its contractors and subcontractors to include in each subcontract the following provisions:
 - **A.** The Agency will comply with all the requirements imposed by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation issued thereunder, and the assurance by the Agency pursuant thereto. The Agency shall include the attached Exhibit "E", Title VI Assurances in all contracts with consultants and contractors performing work on the Project that ensure compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 49 C.F.R. Part 21, and related statutes and regulations.
 - **B.** The Agency will comply with all the requirements as imposed by the ADA, the regulations of the Federal government issued thereunder, and assurance by the Agency pursuant thereto.
 - C. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity; may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work; may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity; may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor or consultant under a contract with any public entity; and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, Florida Statutes, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
 - D. In accordance with Section 287.134, Florida Statutes, an entity or affiliate who has been placed on the Discriminatory Vendor List, kept by the Florida Department of Management Services, may not submit a bid on a contract to provide goods or services to a public entity; may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work; may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity; may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor or consultant under a contract with any public entity; and may not transact business with any public entity.
 - **E.** An entity or affiliate who has had its Certificate of Qualification suspended, revoked, denied or have further been determined by the Department to be a non-responsible contractor may not submit a bid or perform work for the construction or repair of a public building or public work on a contract with the Agency.
 - F. Neither the Agency nor any of its contractors or their subcontractors shall enter into any contract, subcontract or arrangement in connection with the Project or any property included or planned to be included in the Project in which any member, officer or employee of the Agency or the locality during tenure or for 2 years thereafter has any interest, direct or indirect. If any such present or former member, officer or employee involuntarily acquires or had acquired prior to the beginning of tenure any such interest, and if such interest is immediately disclosed to the Agency, the Agency, with prior approval of the Department, may waive the prohibition contained in this paragraph provided that any such present member, officer or employee shall not participate in any action by the Agency or the locality relating to such contract, subcontract or arrangement. The Agency shall insert in all contracts entered into in connection with the Project or any property included or planned to be included in any Project, and shall require its contractors to insert in each of their subcontracts, the following provision:

"No member, officer or employee of the Agency or of the locality during his tenure or for 2 years thereafter shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the proceeds thereof."

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The provisions of this paragraph shall not be applicable to any agreement between the Agency and its fiscal depositories or to any agreement for utility services the rates for which are fixed or controlled by a governmental agency.

G. No member or delegate to the Congress of the United States shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or any benefit arising therefrom.

15. Indemnification and Insurance:

A. It is specifically agreed between the parties executing this Agreement that it is not intended by any of the provisions of any part of this Agreement to create in the public or any member thereof, a third party beneficiary under this Agreement, or to authorize anyone not a party to this Agreement to maintain a suit for personal injuries or property damage pursuant to the terms or provisions of this Agreement. The Agency guarantees the payment of all just claims for materials, supplies, tools, or labor and other just claims against the Agency or any subcontractor, in connection with this Agreement. Additionally, the Agency agrees to include the following indemnification in all contracts with contractors/subcontractors, or consultants/subconsultants who perform work in connection with this Agreement:

"To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Agency's contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Agency, the State of Florida, Department of Transportation, and its officers and employees, from liabilities, damages, losses and costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness or intentional wrongful misconduct of the contractor and persons employed or utilized by the contractor in the performance of this Contract."

This indemnification shall survive the termination of this Contract. Nothing contained in this paragraph is intended to nor shall it constitute a waiver of the State of Florida and the Agency's sovereign immunity.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Agency's consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Agency, the State of Florida, Department of Transportation, and its officers and employees, from liabilities, damages, losses and costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees, to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness or intentional wrongful misconduct of the consultant and persons employed or utilized by the consultant in the performance of this Contract.

This indemnification shall survive the termination of this Contract. Nothing contained in this paragraph is intended to nor shall it constitute a waiver of the State of Florida and the Agency's sovereign immunity."

B. The Agency shall, or cause its contractor or consultant to carry and keep in force, during the term of this Agreement, a general liability insurance policy or policies with a company or companies authorized to do business in Florida, affording public liability insurance with combined bodily injury limits of at least \$200,000 per person and \$300,000 each occurrence, and property damage insurance of at least \$200,000 each occurrence, for the services to be rendered in accordance with this Agreement. The Agency shall also, or cause its contractor or consultant to carry and keep in force Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the State of Florida under the Workers' Compensation Law. With respect to any general liability insurance policy required pursuant to this Agreement, all such policies shall be issued by companies licensed to do business in the State of Florida. The Agency shall provide to the Department certificates showing the required coverage to be in effect with endorsements showing the Department to be an additional insured prior to commencing any work under this Agreement. Policies that include Self Insured Retention will not be accepted. The certificates and policies shall provide that in the event of any material change in or cancellation of the policies reflecting the required coverage, thirty days advance notice shall be given to the Department or as provided in accordance with Florida law.

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16. Miscellaneous Provisions:

- A. The Agency will be solely responsible for compliance with all applicable environmental regulations, for any liability arising from non-compliance with these regulations, and will reimburse the Department for any loss incurred in connection therewith. The Agency will be responsible for securing any applicable permits. The Agency shall include in all contracts and subcontracts for amounts in excess of \$150,000, a provision requiring compliance with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387).
- **B.** The Department shall not be obligated or liable hereunder to any individual or entity not a party to this Agreement.
- **C.** In no event shall the making by the Department of any payment to the Agency constitute or be construed as a waiver by the Department of any breach of covenant or any default which may then exist on the part of the Agency and the making of such payment by the Department, while any such breach or default shall exist, shall in no way impair or prejudice any right or remedy available to the Department with respect to such breach or default.
- **D.** If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected. In such an instance, the remainder would then continue to conform to the terms and requirements of applicable law.
- **E.** By execution of the Agreement, the Agency represents that it has not paid and, also agrees not to pay, any bonus or commission for the purpose of obtaining an approval of its application for the financing hereunder.
- **F.** Nothing in the Agreement shall require the Agency to observe or enforce compliance with any provision or perform any act or do any other thing in contravention of any applicable state law. If any of the provisions of the Agreement violate any applicable state law, the Agency will at once notify the Department in writing in order that appropriate changes and modifications may be made by the Department and the Agency to the end that the Agency may proceed as soon as possible with the Project.
- G. In the event that this Agreement involves constructing and equipping of facilities, the Agency shall submit to the Department for approval all appropriate plans and specifications covering the Project. The Department will review all plans and specifications and will issue to the Agency a written approval with any approved portions of the Project and comments or recommendations covering any remainder of the Project deemed appropriate. After resolution of these comments and recommendations to the Department's satisfaction, the Department will issue to the Agency a written approval with said remainder of the Project. Failure to obtain this written approval shall be sufficient cause of nonpayment by the Department.
- **H.** Upon completion of right-of-way activities on the Project, the Agency must certify compliance with all applicable federal and state requirements. Certification is required prior to authorization for advertisement for or solicitation of bids for construction of the Project, including if no right-of-way is required.
- I. The Agency will certify in writing, prior to Project closeout that the Project was completed in accordance with applicable plans and specifications, is in place on the Agency's facility, adequate title is in the Agency's name, and the Project is accepted by the Agency as suitable for the intended purpose.
- J. The Agency agrees that no federally-appropriated funds have been paid, or will be paid by or on behalf of the Agency, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence any officer or employee of any federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any federal contract, the making of any federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension,

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continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement. If any funds other than federally-appropriated funds have been paid by the Agency to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions. The Agency shall require that the language of this paragraph be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly. No funds received pursuant to this contract may be expended for lobbying the Legislature, the judicial branch or a state agency.

- **K.** The Agency may not permit the Engineer of Record to perform Construction, Engineering and Inspection services on the Project.
- L. The Agency agrees to maintain any project not on the State Highway System constructed under this Agreement. If the Agency constructs any improvement on Department right-of-way, the Agency ☑ will ☐ will not maintain the improvements made for their useful life.
- M. The Agency shall comply with all applicable federal guidelines, procedures, and regulations. If at any time a review conducted by Department and or FHWA reveals that the applicable federal guidelines, procedures, and regulations were not followed by the Agency and FHWA requires reimbursement of the funds, the Agency will be responsible for repayment to the Department of all funds awarded under the terms of this Agreement.

N. The Agency:



EXHIBIT "L"

LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

Paragraph 16.L is modified to include the following provisions:

- Until such time as the Project is removed from the project highway pursuant to paragraphs 3 and 4 of this Exhibit, the Agency shall, at all times, maintain the Project in a reasonable manner and with due care in accordance with all applicable Department guidelines, standards, and procedures hereinafter called "Project Standards." Specifically, the Agency agrees to:
 - a) Properly water and fertilize all plants, keeping them as free as practicable from disease and harmful insects:
 - b) Properly mulch plant beds;
 - c) Keep the premises free of weeds;
 - d) Mow and/or cut the grass to the proper length;
 - e) Properly prune all plants which responsibility includes removing dead or diseased parts of plants and/or pruning such parts thereof which present a visual hazard for those using the roadway; and
 - f) Remove or replace dead or diseased plants in their entirety, or remove or replace those plants that fall below original Project Standards.

The Agency agrees to repair, remove or replace at its own expense all or part of the Project that falls below Project Standards caused by the Agency's failure to maintain the same in accordance with the provisions of this Exhibit. In the event any part or parts of the Project, including plants, has to be removed and replaced for whatever reason, then they shall be replaced by parts of the same grade, size, and specification as provided in the original plans for the Project. Furthermore, the Agency agrees to keep litter removed from the project highway.

- 2. Maintenance of the Project shall be subject to periodic inspections by the Department. In the event that any of the aforementioned responsibilities are not carried out or are otherwise determined by the Department to not be in conformance with the applicable Project Standards, the Department, in addition to its right of termination under paragraph 4(a) in this Exhibit, may at its option perform any necessary maintenance without the need of any prior notice and charge the cost thereof to the Agency.
- 3. It is understood between the parties to this Agreement that any portion of or the entire Project may be removed, relocated or adjusted at any time in the future as determined to be necessary by the Department in order that the adjacent state road be widened, altered or otherwise changed to meet with the future criteria or planning of the Department. The Agency shall be given notice regarding such removal, relocation or adjustment and shall be allowed 60 days to remove all or part of the Project at its own cost. The Agency will own that part of the Project it removed. After the 60-day removal period, the Department will become the owner of the unresolved portion of the Project, and the Department then may remove, relocate or adjust the Project as it deems best, with the Agency being responsible for the cost incurred for the removal of the Project.
- 4. This Exhibit shall remain in force during the life of the originally installed landscaping and/or the life of any replacement landscaping installed with the mutual consent of the parties hereto until superseded by a Landscape Maintenance Agreement between the Department and the Agency.

FINANCIAL IMPACT SUMMARY STATEMENT:

Unknown at this time. It will depend on the number of cases sent to the special magistrate. This will effect the General Fund.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, Bay County has a Code Enforcement Board that hears all code enforcement cases for the County. In December 2014, the Code Enforcement Division was assigned responsibility to oversee enforcement in all unfit and unsafe structure cases resulting in a significant increase in caseload. This increased caseload has caused a backlog of cases needing to be heard by the Code Enforcement Board which can delay enforcement action by several months.

Staff proposes that the use of a Special Magistrate to hear lower priority and repeat code enforcement cases as needed to clear the backlog of cases and shorten enforcement time. Both Florida Statute Chapter 162 and Bay County Code currently allow the Board to designate a Special Magistrate to hear code enforcement cases. However, this proposed code amendment clarifies that the Board need not refer cases to the Special Magistrate on a case by case basis but can, instead, more broadly refer cases as needed. The amendment also clarifies that the Special Magistrate would have the same enforcement status as the Code Enforcement Board.

Staff recommends that the Board conduct a public hearing and adopt the attached ordinance amending Bay County Code Sec. 7-28.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BAY COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER SEVEN, ARTICLE II, CODES ENFORCEMENT BOARD, OF THE BAY COUNTY CODE; MODIFYING THE PROVISION THAT ALLOWS THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO DESIGNATE A SPECIAL MAGISTRATE TO HEAR CODE ENFORCEMENT CASES.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Bay County, Florida as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 7, Article II, Codes Enforcement Board, is amended with additions being identified as underlined text and deletions as strikethroughs as follows:

Sec. 7-28. – Created; composition; terms; removal; organization.

- (a) Pursuant to F.S. ch. 162, there is hereby created a codes enforcement board of the county which shall consist of seven members All members shall be residents of the county and shall serve without compensation. The board of county commissioners may also designate a special master magistrate to perform the functions of the codes enforcement board on a case by case basis. A special magistrate shall have the same status as the codes enforcement board under this chapter. References in this chapter to the codes enforcement board shall include a special magistrate if the context permits.
- SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board of County Commissioners of Bay County, Florida that if any section, subsection, clause, phrase, or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not be construed as to render invalid or unconstitutional the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.
- SECTION 3. INCLUSION IN CODE. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Bay County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Bay County, Florida: that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intention: and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article" or other appropriate designation.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. A certified copy of this Ordinance as enacted shall be filed by the Clerk of the Board with the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida within ten (10) days after enactment, and this Ordinance shall take effect immediately in accordance with Section 125.66 (2), Florida Statutes.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, currently, Bay County has a Code Enforcement Board that hears all code enforcement cases for the County. However, both Chapter 162 of Florida Statutes and Chapter 7 of the Bay County Code gives the Board of County Commissioners the authority to also designate a Special Magistrate to hear code enforcement cases; and

WHEREAS, in December 2014, the Code Enforcement Division was assigned responsibility to oversee enforcement in all unfit and unsafe structure cases. This added responsibility has significantly increased the caseload of the department and also increased the amount of cases scheduled for hearing before the Code Enforcement Board, which has caused a backlog increasing enforcement time by several months; and

WHEREAS, the Code Enforcement Board is comprised of seven members and includes an architect, engineer, general contractor and a realtor and therefore, the Code Enforcement Board is well qualified to continue hearing code enforcement cases, especially those involving unfit and unsafe structures; and

WHEREAS, designating that a Special Magistrate is also authorized to hear code enforcement cases, especially lower priority and repeat code violation cases, would help decrease the backlog of cases and lead to faster, more efficient code enforcement.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Bay County, Florida as follows:

Section 1. The Board hereby:

- a) Designates that a Special Magistrate is authorized to hear code enforcement cases as needed.
- b) Delegates to the County Attorney the authority to hire a Special Magistrate to hear code enforcement cases.

Section 2. <u>Effect on other ordinances or resolutions.</u> By this Resolution the Board does not intend to amend, delete or annul the intent or effect of any existing ordinance or resolution affecting the powers and authority of the Code Enforcement Board or County Attorney.

Section 3. <u>Severability</u>: If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this resolution is for any reason invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court or regulatory body of competent jurisdiction, such decisions shall not effect the validity of the remaining portions hereof. 



(Rural) Operating Request Proposed Project Description

- 1. The Bay County Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the recognized body and designated recipient for Bay County, Florida Demand Response system. However, Bay County Board of County Commissioners is the designated government body to receive the funds on behalf of the (TPO). Per the Bay County TPO by laws, the TPO purpose and functions are:
- (a) To carry out a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process in Bay County consistent with applicable federal, state and local laws in cooperation with the Florida Department of Transportation;
- (b) To develop transportation systems embracing various modes of transportation to maximize the mobility of people and goods within and through Bay County and minimize, to the maximum extent feasible, transportation-related fuel consumption and air pollution;
- (c) To develop transportation plans and programs, in cooperation with the Florida Department of Transportation, which provide for the development of transportation facilities that will function as a multi-modal and intermodal transportation system for Bay County; and
- (d) To assure the continued eligibility for the receipt of federal and state capital and operating assistance for transportation projects in Bay County.
 - 2. The Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) serves as the CTC and oversee the Demand Response operations and fixed route operations on behalf of Bay County citizens. This is in conjunction with the Bay County (TPO). Bay County (BOCC) has 4 dedicated transit staff overseeing the programs and transit operator. Currently, First Transit is the Demand Response and fixed route operator with over 70 employees for both operations.
 - The Bay County Board of County Commissioners along with Bay County TPO oversee the transit operator. The transit operator provides the necessary training, management, and insurance.
 - 4. The fixed route and Demand Response operator provides the maintenance for all vehicles.
 - 5. The agency currently has an average total of 70 transportation employees. 50 plus drivers have CDL certifications.
 - 6. We currently have a deviated fixed route system that has 9 routes that operate Mon-Saturday 6:00 am to 8:00 pm. Our system safety plan and drug free workplace documents are currently in FDOT Transcip data base. Currently the system average is around 55,000 rides per month.

Development Plan

INTRODUCTION TO THE SERVICE AREA

The preparation and development of a Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP) provides agencies, coordinators, planners and citizens with a blueprint for coordinated service, a framework for service performance evaluation and a means to project a vision in the transportation disadvantaged services for the future. A strategic approach has been used to develop this TDSP. First, an evaluation of the current strengths and weaknesses of the service area is accomplished. This includes compiling a database of demographics and existing conditions, and reviewing TD related plans and service providers. This will answer the question: Where are we? Secondly, there is an in-depth assessment of the goals and objectives, which will provide direction and answer the question: Where do we go from here? This is accomplished by reviewing the supply and demand of services and funding provided. An evaluation of existing services versus TD needs and demands is undertaken using a transportation service supply and condition approach. Thirdly, we answer the question: How do we get where we want to go from where we are? This is accomplished by developing a plan to achieve the service area's goals while building on the strengths and eliminating the weaknesses.

Background of the Transportation Disadvantaged Program

The State of Florida is a recognized leader of providing coordinated human services transportation for individuals that are transportation disadvantaged. In 1989, a major commitment to mobility in the State of Florida was formalized when the legislature revised Chapter 427 Florida Statutes (F.S.) creating the Florida Coordinated Transportation System (FCTS) and a dedicated funding source. The FCTS includes the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD); Designated Official Planning Agencies (DOPA); Community Transportation Coordinators (CTC); Local Coordinating Boards (LCB); Transportation Operators (TO); purchasing and funding agencies/entities; and most importantly, those in need, the Transportation Disadvantaged (TD). Chapter 427 defines TD persons as those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation. The legislation also includes children who are "high-risk" or "at-risk" of developmental disabilities.

Community Transportation Coordinator Designation Date/History

In 1983, Bay County Council on Aging, Inc. was named the Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) and operator for the transportation disadvantaged and the program was implemented by gradually adding participating agencies to the program until all agencies who requested the service were served. On July 1, 1984, the program was fully implemented and served all agencies in the service area that were willing to participate in the coordinated system.

In November 2003, Tri-County Community Council was appointed as CTC on an emergency basis when Bay County Council on Aging, Inc. chose not to be the CTC. This was followed by a Request For Proposal (RFP) to pick a permanent CTC. Tri-County Community Council was chosen as the CTC at the conclusion of the RFP process in April 2004. Tri-County Community Council was selected once again to continue as the CTC for Bay County in 2009.

Effective January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014, Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) was appointed as CTC on an emergency basis when Tri-County Community Council chose not to be the CTC. Bay County BCC selected Pensacola Bay Transportation as the contract operator to provide coordinated transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged. Pensacola Bay Transportation discontinued its service as of May 31, 2014 and Bay County BCC contracted with First Transit under an emergency basis to begin June 1, 2014.

Bay County BCC requested to remain the CTC and was approved by the CTD for a five year period effective July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2019. Bay County BCC will need to select a contract operator through an appropriate procurement process in the near future.

Organization Charts

Organizational charts have been included in the appendices. The charts identify those involved in the provision of service, from the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, through the local Coordinating Board, to the Community Transportation Coordinator and the Planning Agency, and to the consumers. The Transportation Disadvantaged Program Concept Chart is shown in Figure 1 and the CTC Organization Chart is shown in Figure 2.

Consistency Review of Other Plans

The Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan is consistent with local government Comprehensive Plans, Regional Policy Plans, Transit Development Plans, Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged 5Yr/20Yr Plan, TPO Long Range Transportation Plans, and Transportation Improvement Programs. These plans are briefly discussed in the sections below. The areas where public transportation is addressed have been highlighted.

Local Government Comprehensive Plans

Local governments who have developed a comprehensive plan and are located within Bay County are as follows: (1) Bay County, (2) Callaway, (3) Cedar Grove, (4) Lynn Haven, (5) Mexico Beach, (6) Panama City, (7) Panama City Beach, (8) Parker, and (9) Springfield. These comprehensive plans are addressed in the following sections. A focus will be placed on the public transportation component of each of the plans.

Bay County (October 20, 2009)

The TDSP is consistent with the following items from the Comprehensive Plan of Bay County.

Transportation Goal: Section 125.01, Florida Statutes provides general authority to the Board of County Commissioners to establish and provide transportation and **public transportation** programs. The goals of the Board relative to transportation programs are: to provide for a safe, convenient and efficient transportation system; to promote the purpose and intent of the Florida Transportation Code; to provide for efficient and effective coordination between transportation planning and land use planning; to promote access management on major thoroughfares; to preserve the functional integrity of the State and County Highway and Road Systems; to establish and maintain level of service standards; to effect improvements to the road and highway network; to establish and maintain regulations governing rights-of-way use, parking, and related activities; to improve the appearance of major routes into and out of the County; to prevent the creation of airport and landing field hazards and land use conflicts; to promote a safe and convenient system for the movement of pedestrians and bicycles, and; to promote and further the laws of the State relative to the transportation system.

Objective 4.16: Participate in the provision of **public transportation**.

Performance Measure: Whether or not the County is eligible for and can justify participation in the program. EXHIBIT B 5311 (Rural) Operating Request Proposed Project Description

This grant application is intended to meet the purpose and functions of the existing level of service of the Bay County Transportation Planning Organization and the Bay County BOCC, but more importantly this project will enhance the mobility of people within the rural areas of Bay County by providing Demand Response. The Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) serves as the CTC and oversee the Demand Response operations and fixed route operations on behalf of Bay County citizens. This is in conjunction with the Bay County (TPO). Bay County (BOCC) has 3 dedicated transit staff overseeing the programs and transit operator. Currently, First Transit is the Demand Response and Fixed Route Operator with over 70 employees for both operations. Currently this is our only contracted operator. Therefore, the distribution of vehicles will be equitable.

The Bay Area Transportation fleet replacement program has not met the vehicle retirement expectations and the vehicle replacement plan has been lacking in previous years. This request is to replace 5 existing vehicles to maintain our required vehicle replacement plan submitted to FDOT and FTA (see vehicle inventory). Replacement of vehicles will decrease the systems vehicle maintenance, thus decreasing road calls, late trips and unhappy customers. With an increase in new vehicles comes a decrease in road calls along with improved service to our customers.

The Bay County Emergency Management Services that owns and maintains the existing communication system is upgrading the system. None of our current vehicle radios will be compatible with the new system. Because of the upgrade in the communication system, we are requesting 23 mobile radios. As we buy new vehicle, we will purchase upgraded radios if it is an option.

The Bay County Board of County Commissioners along with Bay County TPO oversee the transit operator. The transit operator provides the necessary training, management, and insurance. The fixed route and Demand Response operator provides the maintenance for all vehicles. The agency currently has an average total of 70 transportation employees and 50 plus drivers have CDL certifications.

1.5 EXHIBIT A 5339 (Rural) Capital Request Project Description

- 1. The Bay County Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the recognized body and designated recipient for Bay County, Florida Demand Response system. However, Bay County Board of County Commissioners is the designated government body to receive the funds on behalf of the (TPO). Per the Bay County TPO by laws, the TPO purpose and functions are:
- (a) To carry out a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process in Bay County consistent with applicable federal, state and local laws in cooperation with the Florida Department of Transportation;
- (b) To develop transportation systems embracing various modes of transportation to maximize the mobility of people and goods within and through Bay County and minimize, to the maximum extent feasible, transportation-related fuel consumption and air pollution;
- (c) To develop transportation plans and programs, in cooperation with the Florida Department of Transportation, which provide for the development of transportation facilities that will function as a multi-modal and intermodal transportation system for Bay County; and
- (d) To assure the continued eligibility for the receipt of federal and state capital and operating assistance for transportation projects in Bay County.
 - 2. The Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) serves as the CTC and oversee the Demand Response operations and fixed route operations on behalf of Bay County citizens. This is in conjunction with the Bay County (TPO). Bay County (BOCC) has 4 dedicated transit staff overseeing the programs and transit operator. Currently, First Transit is the Demand Response and fixed route operator with over 70 employees for both operations.
 - 3. The Bay County Board of County Commissioners along with Bay County TPO oversee the transit operator. The transit operator provides the necessary training, management, and insurance.
 - 4. The fixed route and Demand Response operator provides the maintenance for all vehicles.
 - 5. The agency currently has an average total of 70 transportation employees. 50 plus drivers have CDL certifications.
 - 6. The Bay County BOCC as the CTC provides demand response in Bay County. However, in the rural area over 1,896 one way passenger trips are provided. The demand is higher than last year and continuing to rise in the non-urban areas of Bay County. The ageing population in the area continues to increase because of retirees and services provided by the two military installations. We are also seeing a great demand on the entire transit system just since the Veterans Hospital/Clinic opened in December, 2016.

Development Plan

INTRODUCTION TO THE SERVICE AREA

The preparation and development of a Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP) provides agencies, coordinators, planners and citizens with a blueprint for coordinated service, a framework for service performance evaluation and a means to project a vision in the transportation disadvantaged services for the future. A strategic approach has been used to develop this TDSP. First, an evaluation of the current strengths and weaknesses of the service area is accomplished. This includes compiling a database of demographics and existing conditions, and reviewing TD related plans and service providers. This will answer the question: Where are we? Secondly, there is an in-depth assessment of the goals and objectives, which will provide direction and answer the question: Where do we go from here? This is accomplished by reviewing the supply and demand of services and funding provided. An evaluation of existing services versus TD needs and demands is undertaken using a transportation service supply and condition approach. Thirdly, we answer the question: How do we get where we want to go from where we are? This is accomplished by developing a plan to achieve the service area's goals while building on the strengths and eliminating the weaknesses.

Background of the Transportation Disadvantaged Program

The State of Florida is a recognized leader of providing coordinated human services transportation for individuals that are transportation disadvantaged. In 1989, a major commitment to mobility in the State of Florida was formalized when the legislature revised Chapter 427 Florida Statutes (F.S.) creating the Florida Coordinated Transportation System (FCTS) and a dedicated funding source. The FCTS includes the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD); Designated Official Planning Agencies (DOPA); Community Transportation Coordinators (CTC); Local Coordinating Boards (LCB); Transportation Operators (TO); purchasing and funding agencies/entities; and most importantly, those in need, the Transportation Disadvantaged (TD). Chapter 427 defines TD persons as those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation. The legislation also includes children who are "high-risk" or "at-risk" of developmental disabilities.

Community Transportation Coordinator Designation Date/History

In 1983, Bay County Council on Aging, Inc. was named the Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) and operator for the transportation disadvantaged and the program was implemented by gradually adding participating agencies to the program until all agencies who requested the service were served. On July 1, 1984, the program was fully implemented and served all agencies in the service area that were willing to participate in the coordinated system.

In November 2003, Tri-County Community Council was appointed as CTC on an emergency basis when Bay County Council on Aging, Inc. chose not to be the CTC. This was followed by a Request For Proposal (RFP) to pick a permanent CTC. Tri-County Community Council was chosen as the CTC at the conclusion of the RFP process in April 2004. Tri-County Community Council was selected once again to continue as the CTC for Bay County in 2009.

Effective January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014, Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) was appointed as CTC on an emergency basis when Tri-County Community Council chose not to be the CTC. Bay County BCC selected Pensacola Bay Transportation as the contract operator to provide coordinated transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged. Pensacola Bay Transportation discontinued its service as of May 31, 2014 and Bay County BCC contracted with First Transit under an emergency basis to begin June 1, 2014.

Bay County BCC requested to remain the CTC and was approved by the CTD for a five year period effective July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2019. Bay County BCC will need to select a contract operator through an appropriate procurement process in the near future.

Organization Charts

Organizational charts have been included in the appendices. The charts identify those involved in the provision of service, from the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, through the local Coordinating Board, to the Community Transportation Coordinator and the Planning Agency, and to the consumers. The Transportation Disadvantaged Program Concept Chart is shown in Figure 1 and the CTC Organization Chart is shown in Figure 2.

Consistency Review of Other Plans

The Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan is consistent with local government Comprehensive Plans, Regional Policy Plans, Transit Development Plans, Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged 5Yr/20Yr Plan, TPO Long Range Transportation Plans, and Transportation Improvement Programs. These plans are briefly discussed in the sections below. The areas where public transportation is addressed have been highlighted.

Local Government Comprehensive Plans

Local governments who have developed a comprehensive plan and are located within Bay County are as follows: (1) Bay County, (2) Callaway, (3) Cedar Grove, (4) Lynn Haven, (5) Mexico Beach, (6) Panama City, (7) Panama City Beach, (8) Parker, and (9) Springfield. These comprehensive plans are addressed in the following sections. A focus will be placed on the public transportation component of each of the plans.

Bay County (October 20, 2009)

The TDSP is consistent with the following items from the Comprehensive Plan of Bay County.

Transportation Goal: Section 125.01, Florida Statutes provides general authority to the Board of County Commissioners to establish and provide transportation and **public transportation** programs. The goals of the Board relative to transportation programs are: to provide for a safe, convenient and efficient transportation system; to promote the purpose and intent of the Florida Transportation Code; to provide for efficient and effective coordination between transportation planning and land use planning; to promote access management on major thoroughfares; to preserve the functional integrity of the State and County Highway and Road Systems; to establish and maintain level of service standards; to effect improvements to the road and highway network; to establish and maintain regulations governing rights-of-way use, parking, and related activities; to improve the appearance of major routes into and out of the County; to prevent the creation of airport and landing field hazards and land use conflicts; to promote a safe and convenient system for the movement of pedestrians and bicycles, and; to promote and further the laws of the State relative to the transportation system.

Objective 4.16: Participate in the provision of public transportation.

Performance Measure: Whether or not the County is eligible for and can justify participation in the program. Policy 4.16.1: The County will participate through the TPO toward continuation of the Bay Town Trolley and Bay Coordinated Transportation programs including an analysis of the feasibility of developing a trolley system to serve the public beach access points, a discussion of alternative parking systems including, but not limited to, fee acquisition, joint parking systems, or financial incentives.

Policy 4.16.2: The County shall participate through the TPO in identifying and analyzing alternative elements of transportation including, but not limited to: (1) Park and Ride options; (2) "Share a Ride" program; (3) **Bay Town Trolley**; and (4) Bicycle/Pedestrian Plan.

Policy 4.16.3: The County shall participate through the TPO in maintaining an inventory of all implemented alternative transportation elements.

PUBLIC HEARING

All interested parties within Bay County, Florida are hereby advised that the Bay County Transportation Planning Organization and Bay County Board of County Commissioners are applying to the Florida Department of Transportation for capital items which include the following 5 cutaways (less than 30' feet); 1 transit bus (greater than 30'feet); radios; software and hardware which total approximately \$975,000.00 and operating assistance which total approximately \$125,000.00 under Grant Sections 5311 & 5339 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991, as amended, for the purchase of vehicles to be used for the provision of public transit services within the Bay Area Transportation Rural Service Area and Bay Town Trolley Small Urban Area.

A Public Hearing has been scheduled at 840 West 11th Street, Panama City, Florida 32401, February 21st, 2017, 9:00 a.m., for the purpose of advising all interested parties of service being contemplated if a grant is awarded, and to ensure that contemplated services would not represent a duplication of current or proposed services provided by existing transit or paratransit operators in the area.

This hearing will be conducted if and only if a written request for the hearing is received by (two days prior to the scheduled hearing).

All interested parties may attend the meeting and be heard. Any person wishing to appeal any decision made by the Bay County Board of County Commissioners at this meeting will need a record of the proceedings. For that purpose, such person may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

1.7 EXHIBIT B 5339 (Rural) Capital Request Proposed Project Description

This grant application is intended to meet the purpose and functions of the existing level of service of the Bay County Transportation Planning Organization and the Bay County BOCC, but more importantly this project will enhance the mobility of people within the rural areas of Bay County by providing Demand Response. The Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) serves as the CTC and oversee the Demand Response operations and fixed route operations on behalf of Bay County citizens. This is in conjunction with the Bay County (TPO). Bay County (BOCC) has 3 dedicated transit staff overseeing the programs and transit operator. Currently, First Transit is the Demand Response and Fixed Route Operator with over 70 employees for both operations. Currently this is our only contracted operator. Therefore, the distribution of vehicles will be equitable.


The Bay Area Transportation fleet replacement program has not met the vehicle retirement expectations and the vehicle replacement plan has been lacking in previous years. This request is to replace 5 existing vehicles to maintain our required vehicle replacement plan submitted to FDOT and FTA (see vehicle inventory). Replacement of vehicles will decrease the systems vehicle maintenance, thus decreasing road calls, late trips and unhappy customers. With an increase in new vehicles comes a decrease in road calls along with improved service to our customers.

The Bay County Emergency Management Services that owns and maintains the existing communication system is upgrading the system. None of our current vehicle radios will be compatible with the new system. Because of the upgrade in the communication system, we are requesting 23 mobile radios. As we buy new vehicle, we will purchase upgraded radios if it is an option.

The Bay County Board of County Commissioners along with Bay County TPO oversee the transit operator. The transit operator provides the necessary training, management, and insurance. The fixed route and Demand Response operator provides the maintenance for all vehicles. The agency currently has an average total of 70 transportation employees and 50 plus drivers have CDL certifications.



4.1 EXHIBIT B 5339 (Small Urban) Capital Request Proposed Project Description

This grant application is intended to meet the purpose and functions of the existing level of service of the Bay County Transportation Planning Organization and the Bay County BOCC, but more importantly this project will enhance the mobility of people within the urban areas of Bay County by providing Demand Response. The Bay County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) serves as the CTC and oversee the Demand Response operations and fixed route operations on behalf of Bay County citizens. This is in conjunction with the Bay County (TPO). Bay County (BOCC) has 3 dedicated transit staff overseeing the programs and transit operator. Currently, First Transit is the Demand Response and Fixed Route Operator with over 70 employees for both operations. Currently this is our only contracted operator. Therefore, the distribution of vehicles will be equitable.

The Bay Town Trolley Fleet replacement program has not met the vehicle retirement expectations and the vehicle replacement plan has been lacking in previous years. This request is for 1 30' Medium duty fixed route vehicle with a ramp to replace and to start and maintain our required vehicle replacement plan submitted to FDOT and FTA (see vehicle inventory). Replacement of vehicles will decrease the systems vehicle maintenance, thus decreasing road calls, late trips and unhappy customers. We are also requesting real time passenger information software, mobile ticketing software, audio visual annunciators and automatic person counters. None of this equipment is currently utilized by the system and is needed for added safety, security, and to assist us in increasing ridership through better meeting the needs of our riders especially the elderly and disabled population. With an increase in new vehicles comes a decrease in road calls along with improved service to our customers. Currently the system average is around 55,000 rides per month.

The Bay County Board of County Commissioners along with Bay County TPO oversee the transit operator. The transit operator provides the necessary training, management, and insurance. The fixed route and Demand Response operator provides the maintenance for all vehicles. The agency currently has an average total of 70 transportation employees and 50 plus drivers have CDL certifications. We currently have a deviated fixed route system that has 9 routes that operate Mon-Saturday 6:00 am to 8:00 pm. Our system safety plan and drug free workplace documents are currently in FDOT Transcip data base.
